The love of Christ and the Fellowship of man were the themes of the sermons preached in Decatur Sunday. Excerpts from five of the sermons are:

Rev. A. B. Brown

"Christ and Light of Life or Three Essentials with One Control" Text: "In Him was Life and the Life was the Light of men."

First essential, Christ is essentially the Light of Life. May we not belittle or limit the Light by thinking of it only as an attribute of Christ. He is Light.

What is more essential to you and me? "Christ, the eternal life was manifested unto us." Without this manifestation we would not know what Christ essentially is.

What is most essential is the reception of the Light of Life, which alone can comfort with perfect peace, complete pardon, inexhaustible supply and is infinite love.
