challenging and too mandatory to permit of hesitation," he said. "An American government cannot permit Americans to starve. The task assumed in federal relief carried us on an uncharted course. Mistakes and errors were inevitable, that we know, but essentially we met the larger responsibility of the situation."

He implied that "emergency," in the sense in which the word applied to the situation of early 1933, was no longer present, but he suggested, also, that reform

must follow recovery. "As the burden lifts," he promised, "the federal government can and will greatly divert itself of the emergency responsibility, but at the same time it cannot ignore the imperfections of the old order."

The President apparently referred indirectly to conditions in Germany in a plea for what he called the "good neighbor" plan of community life.

Guinazu of Argentina, president of the league council, and urgent telegrams were dispatched to governments convoking Saturday's meeting.

It was believed the council would meet as early Saturday morning as all members of the council could be assembled.

The league assembly, at which all nations of the league—nearly three score—are represented may be convoked next week. It is technically in continuous session as the annual meeting was not

formally ended last week because of the crisis.

A member of the council told the United Press that the idea had been advanced privately of asking the United States to dispatch an American diplomat or military officer by airplane to observe the area of Italian invasion and the fighting.

He referred to the precedent in which the United States participated in a military mission to Manchuria in 1931.

American circles suggested that the United States would decline the proposal if it were made.
