

NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, trustee of Wabash School township, in Wabash County, State of Indiana, and the Advisory Board of said township, will receive sealed bids at the office of said trustee at Geneva in the Township, on the 15th day of December, 1935, for the reconditioning, remodeling, and otherwise building and constructing the Geneva High School building at Geneva, and said township, for the erection and construction of a room or building in connection with and under the same roof of said school building, in which to teach and instruct the students of said township the arts of agriculture, and of practical mental culture, and in which to hold school or township entertainments, or to be used for township purposes, all work to be done, according to the plans and specifications prepared by Charles H. Houck, architect, and heretofore adopted by said trustee and said advisory board, and now on file in the office of said trustee, and is \$50,000.00.

Bids will be received in accordance with said specifications for the following items as designated by the architect in said plans and specifications: (1) the cost of the contract, (2) heating and ventilating, (3) electric, (4) plumbing and sewer, (5) painting; and bids will also be received for a combination of any two or more of said items.

Proposals will be properly and completely executed on proposal forms furnished by the architect in accordance with form 86 with non-collusion affidavit as required by the statutes of the State of Indiana, and must be accompanied by the following Form 56A prepared by the State Board of Accounts, for bids of \$50,000.00 or more.

Each bidder shall deposit with his bid a certified check made payable to Jesse C. Mann, trustee, in sum equal to one percent of the amount of said bid as a guarantee and evidence of good faith, that he will accept the contract and carry out the construction of the work bid upon if awarded the contract.

The successful bidder will be required to give a surety bond subject to the approval of said trustee in a sum equal to the full amount of his bid insuring the completion of the work in all things according to the specifications and drawings therefor.

The contractor, in doing the work, shall comply with the terms and conditions of the Emergency Relief Appropriation Act of Congress of 1935, and the regulations issued thereunder by the President of the United States, and rules and regulations of the Public Works Administration (relating to grants made by the United States under said act) dated November 25, 1935, as prescribed by the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works, and as amended on October 7th, 1935.

Wage rates on this work shall not be less than the prescribed scale of wages as determined pursuant to the provisions of chapter 319 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Indiana of 1935, and as approved by the Federal Government.

Wages shall be paid from funds derived from the sale of the United States for such purposes and also from the sale of bonds to be issued by said school township and said civil township.

No bidder may withdraw his bid for a period of thirty days after date set for opening of bids.

The undersigned reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

The bidder will be required to show in his bid the total amount he will allow for the removal of masonry, materials to be used herein that were salvaged from the former school building.

Instructions to bidders, plans, specifications, etc., are on file in the office of the trustee, and also in the State Board of Accounts at Indianapolis, Indiana, or may be obtained from Charles H. Houck, architect, Rooms 7 and 8, Patterson Block, Munroe, Indiana. Bidders may secure complete specifications and private examination by depositing \$25.00 with the architect as a guarantee for the return of the same within one week from receipt of the same.



