## LARGE VOLCANO

Old residents of Hawaii said the eruption marked the first time in recent history that the fire display has been visible in Honolulu, indicating tremendous activity within the crater.

The 10-mile crater, a vast ulcer in the bleak crest of Mauna Loa, was throwing up columns of yellow smoke which stretched away more than 100 miles in a widening arc over the Pacific.

Violent earth shocks, which preceded the eruption, spilled heavy waves along the coast of the island of Hawaii, on which Mauna Loa is situated, doing minor damage to coast shipping.

The weather bureau in Honolulu

reported no tidal wave had occurred. Earth tremors, which started early yesterday, were all minor, a customary prelude to an eruption either at Kilauea or Mokuaweo, Hawaii's two active craters.

Planes took off from here at dawn to fly over the crater, 40 miles from the seacoast. Tourists were loaded in steamers at Honolulu, 200 miles north, and others were driving upward toward the volcano house at Kilauea, nearest point to the crater.

From there parties will proceed afoot or by horseback on the last 20-mile journey over trails of crumbled lava to the edge of the firepit.

Dr. Thomas A. Jiggar, volcanologist at Kilauea volcano observatory, predicted only a few hours before the eruption that an out-

break was improbable.

Hawaiians, who always have shown an uncanny ability to forecast an eruption, had talked of "volcano weather," however, after earth tremors rocked the island.

above a year ago.

"Furniture production compared favorably with the like periods in the last five years.

"Coal lines were a little less active during the last half of October, and the total output was slightly under a year ago. Electricity production made a little more than the usual seasonal gain.

"Automobile manufacturers were relatively busy, but fewer automobiles were assembled than during

October, 1934. Most manufacturers of automobile parts and accessories operated on schedules well above the like periods in the past four years.

"Manufacturers of heating apparatus, including stoves and steam fittings, were busier. Most foundries operated on schedules about equal to a month ago. Steel ingot production was scheduled at a slightly lower date late in October.

"Check transactions made about the usual seasonal gain to a point well above October, 1934. Collections continued to improve. Life insurance sales were slightly above a year ago.

"There was a marked decrease in the number of used car sales. Most manufacturers had discontinued 1935 models and few 1936 models were available for delivery. Used car sales made less than the usual seasonal decline and were higher than during any other October.

"The volume of newspaper advertising was well above a month and a year ago," the report said.

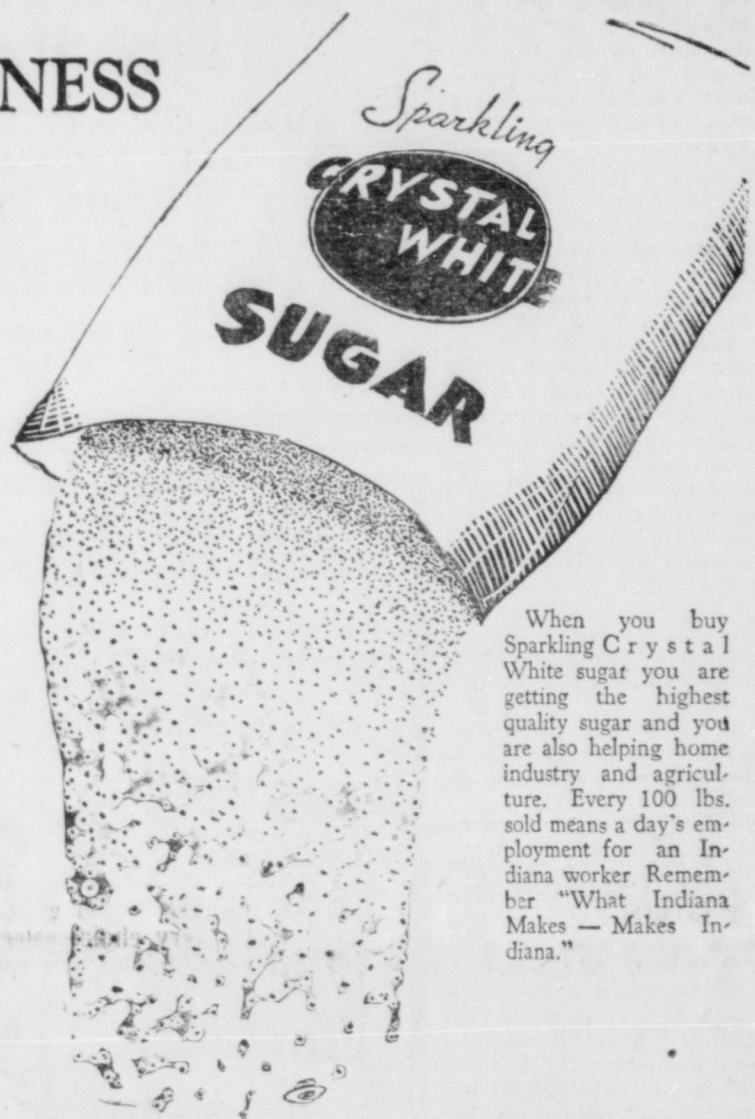
