## HEROES OF AMERICAN HISTORY



HIS PEN WAS MIGHTIER THAN A SWORD.

John Hancock attended Harvard University and then entered his uncle's trading business. At 27 he fell heir both to the prosperous business and to a large personal fortune. His wealth and social position made him a great influence in the Colonies. The battles of Lexington and Concord were directly due to the attempt of the English General Gage to capture him and Samuel Adams as the leaders of the Revolution.

In 1776 Hancock was the first boldy to affix his signature to the Declaration of Independence, a very brave move, when it is considered that as first published the Declaration went abroad with only his signature on it. His name is now an expression to signify the signing of any great document.

JOHN HANCOCK

Hancock fought in Rhode Island during the war and attained the rank of major general. He was the first governor of Massachusetts, and his popularity was attested by his re-election eleven times! He served in that office in 1793.
