governor may again inject himself into the case at the last minute. Observers believe that in event of a disagreement Kimberling would follow Hoffman's instructions as against Wilentz's.

A few minutes after Wilentz had

expressed his confusion, C. Lloyd Fisher, Hauptmann's lawyer, added still another contribution to the puzzling developments which have marked the case by demanding that the Hunterdon county grand jury be convened to investigate Wendel's possible connection with the kidnap-killer of baby Lindbergh.

Fisher's demand was in a telegram which he sent to Judge Thomas W. Trenchard, the jurist before whom Hauptmann was tried and condemned more than a year ago. The telegram demanded the removal of Prosecutor Antony M. Hauck, Jr., the appointment of a special prosecutor, and a stay for Hauptmann.

Capture Suspect
New York, Apr. 3.—(UPI)—A suspect in the alleged kidnaping and torture of Paul H. Wendel, disbanded Trenton lawyer, who made and repudiated a confession that he abducted Charles A. Lindbergh, Jr., has been captured, it was announced today by Assistant Chief Inspector John J. Lyons of the detective division.

Wendel claimed he was abducted near his Manhattan hotel and taken by several men to a Brooklyn house where, he charged, he was tortured for 10 days into signing a confession. Then, he said, he taken to the home of Ellis Parker, detective, in Mount Holly, N. J.

Lyons would reveal no information concerning the suspect.

Neither would District Attorney William F. X. Georhan of Brooklyn comment, except to say that a check by his aides so far has established the truth of Wendel's assertions.

Washington, April 3—(UPI)—The national labor relations board announced today that complaint had


been issued against International Harvester Co., Fort Wayne, Ind., charging alleged fostering and domination of a so-called company union known as the Harvester industrial council.
