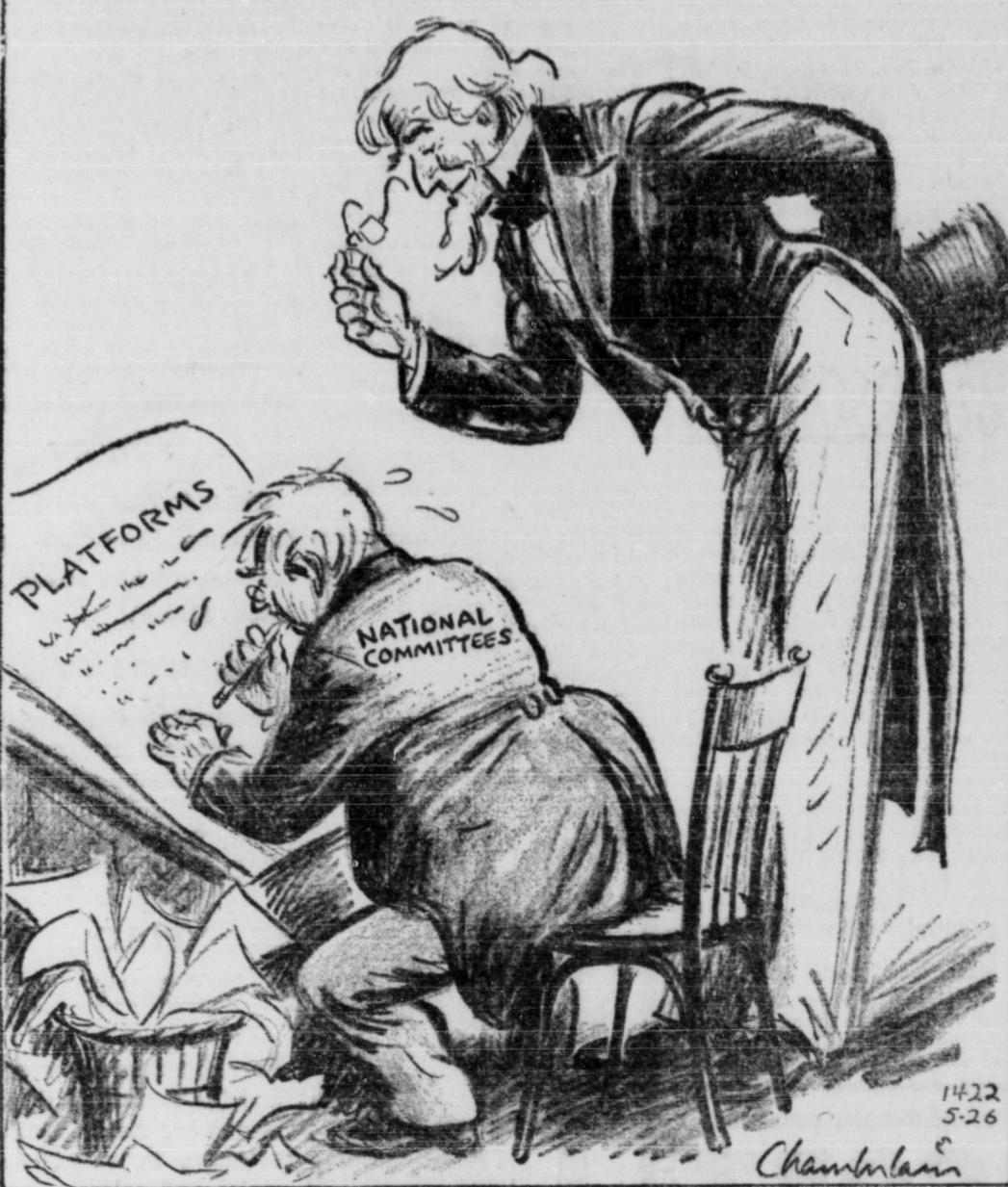

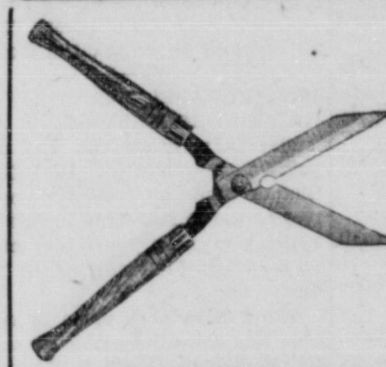
Modern Etiquette By ROBERTA LEE
