## HONOR STUDENTS ARE ANNOUNCED

**High Ranking Eighth Grade Students Of County Are Listed**

Dorothy Hoffman will carry the county banner in the annual county eighth grade commencement exercises at the Decatur high school auditorium on the afternoon of June 13. C. E. Striker, county school superintendent, announced this afternoon.

Dorothy, a student of the eighth grade school in Washington township, established the highest scholastic record for the year of any student in the county, which entitles her to carry the county banner, symbolic of that honor.

Mr. Striker also named those, who, by virtue of having the highest grades in their individual townships, are entitled to carry the banner of that township during the exercises.

These are: Harry Bleke, Union; Mary Rabbitt, Root; Marvin Schroeder, Preble; Donna Zimmerman, Kirkland; Robert Mann, Washington, whose rating was highest, excluding Miss Hoffman's; Myrtle Death, St. Mary's; Betty Jean White, Blue Creek; Vera M. Mautler, French; Majeska Baumgartner, Hartford; Clifton Gerber, Washah and Lester Strahm, Jefferson.

The records of these 13 students were considered exceptionally fine by the school officials since an unusually large class is to graduate this year, 269 in number.
