

Knox learned of his nomination when he stopped off at Michigan City, Ind., while driving to his Chicago office from Cleveland. Hot and weary when he reached Chicago, he went directly to his 20-room apartment for bath and a shave.

Later at his office in the Chicago Daily News, of which he is publisher, he talked of the convention, Governor Landon, and the Republican platform.

The office was decked with flowers from his employees. His desk was piled with congratulatory telegrams, including ones from Sen. Arthur Vandenberg, former vice-president Charles G. Dawes, former Gov. Frank Lowden of Illinois, Bertrand H. Snell, his friend James M. Cox, onetime Democratic candidate for president, and a "rough rider" pal of Spanish American war

"Don't forget that the big news of the convention is the nomination of Governor Landon for president," Knox cautioned reporters who crowded into his office. "He's the captain and I'm just the first mate."
