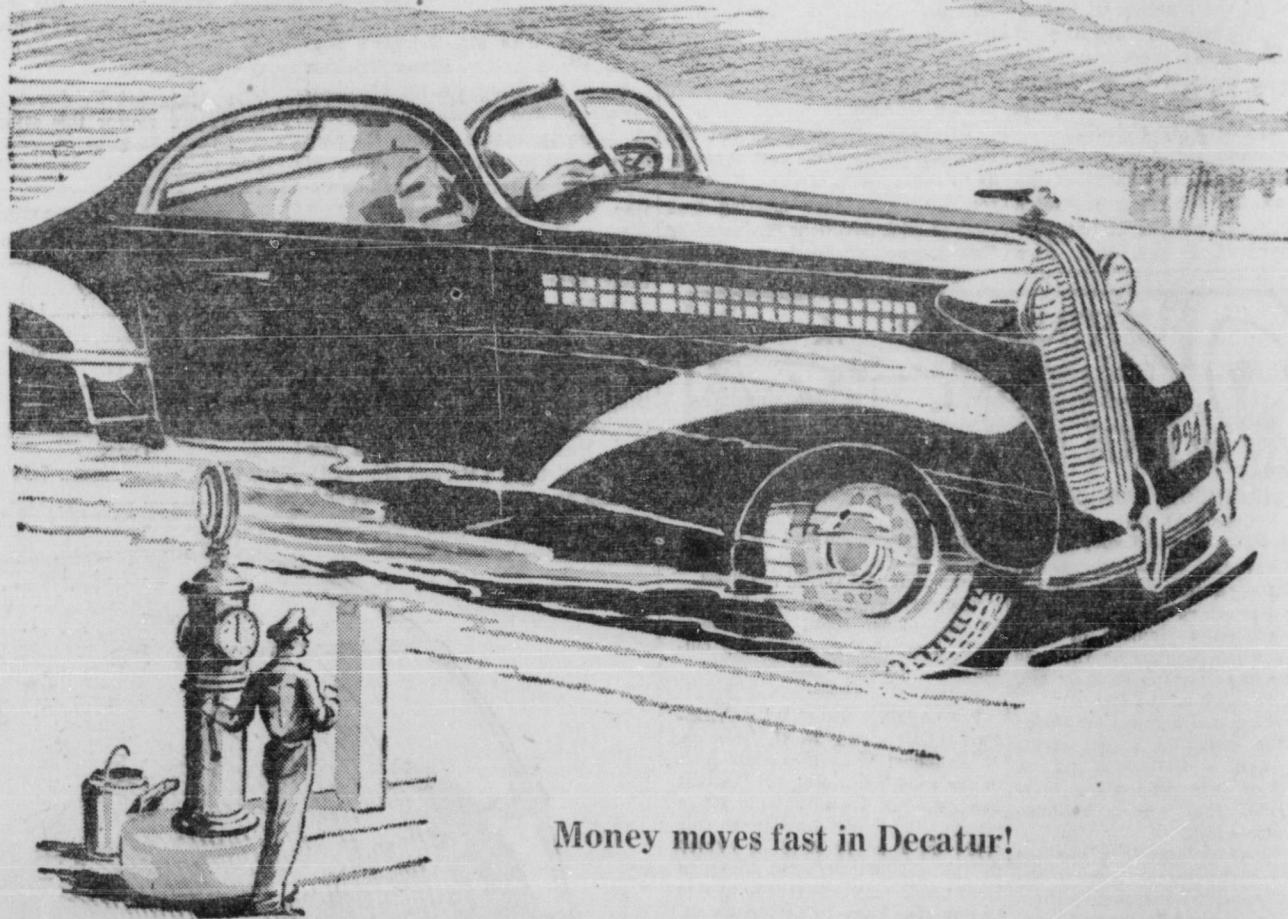
You Can't Get Away From It!

DEMO CAMPAIGN
IS OUTLINEDJames A. Farley To Open
National Headquarters
August 1Washington, July 9.—(U.P.)—New
dealers are counting today upon
organized and independent pro-
gressive endorsement to offset the
agrarian political bolt organ-
ized by William Lemke, farm belt
presidential candidate of the new-
ly formed Union party. The ex-
pected progressive endorsement of
President Roosevelt would be a
part of the continuing process of
political party realignment which
received tremendous impetus in
the 1932 election.Campaign plans outlined here
by Democratic committee chair-
man James A. Farley, provide for
opening of national headquarters in
the Biltmore Hotel, New York, Aug.
1. The Washington commit-
tee headquarters will maintain a
skeleton staff. There will be no
regional headquarters, Farley said
although there may be one or two
speakers' bureau representatives
outside New York City.Rep. Sam Rayburn, D., Texas
has been named chairman of the
speakers' bureau with headquar-
ters in New York. Mr. Roosevelt's
formal campaign will begin short-
ly after Sept. 1. Farley estimatednew deal campaign expenditures
at \$2,000,000, against \$3,000,000 for
the Republicans.Plans for a progressive confer-
ence, similar to that held here in
1930, are scheduled to be an-
nounced next week by Sen. Robert
M. La Follette, co-leader of the
Progressive party of Wisconsin.
New deal strategists refuse to dis-
cuss for publication their hopes
for that conference. But it is evi-
dent in Washington that they ex-
pect full throated endorsement of
the Roosevelt-Garner ticket, along
with several recommendations for
making the new deal bigger and
better.Whether that endorsement will
be sufficient to protect new deal
political pastures against Lemke
will depend somewhat upon next
week's developments in Cleve-
land. Dr. Francis E. Townsend,
co-founder of old age revolving
pensions, Inc., next Wednesday in
that city will call to order the
second annual Townsend conven-
tion.The Townsend meeting may be-
come the medium of left wing po-
litical mergers. It will afford an
opportunity for Townsends to
endorse Lemke, who already is
backed by Father Charles E.
Coughlin's national union for
social justice. It may draw into
the Lemke parade that remnant
of the late Huey P. Long's po-
litical army now captained by
the Rev. Gerald L. K. Smith.The merged and properly led
forces represented by a Lemke-
Coughlin-Townsend-Smith coal-tion would have large political
possibilities. The tendency of
such a political movement would
be to absorb more Democratic
than Republican votes and in a
close state it might be the factor
determining whether vital elector-
al votes would go to Gov. Alf M.
Landon or Mr. Roosevelt.Answers To Test
