The matter of erecting traffic signs in conformity with the state law which sets the speed limit at 30 miles an hour in the residential districts and 20 miles an hour in the business district was also brought up. Both the erection of the caution light and the speed signs were referred to the board of public works and safety in conjunction with the city engineer with power to act.
