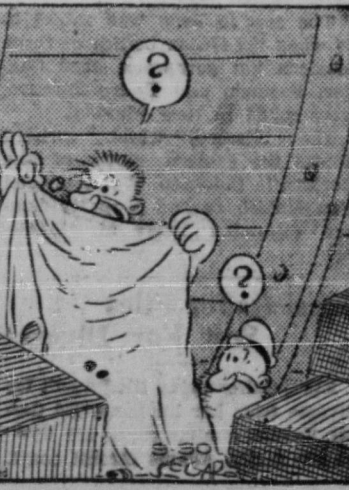

CHINA, JAPAN AGAIN AT ODDS

Two Far East Nations Again Entangled In Di culties

Shanghai, Sept. 30—(UP)—China and Japan approached an impasse in their diplomatic relations today. Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek, hurrying to Nanking by airplane, will meet Japanese ambassador Shigeru Kawagoe and, according to Chinese sources, reject the four Japanese "demands" presented as a basis for peace. In return, Chiang will present four demands to Japan.

The general, long conciliatory in his attitude toward the Japanese was understood to have yielded to pressure of anti-Japanese elements in his cabinet and will take a strong stand.

The four Japanese demands, according to Chinese sources, were:
1. A grant of autonomy to the five northern provinces: Hopei, Chahar, Suiyuan, Shantung and Shanxi as a buffer state against Mongolia and Russia.

2. Economic cooperation with Japan, meaning lower tariffs on Japanese imports and granting of mining, communication, agricultural and industrial rights to Japanese exploiting interests, including the south Manchurian railway.

3. The right to station Japanese troops in the Yangtze river ports and on Hainan Island, to protect Japanese interests. The Japanese now are allowed only to keep troops in the treaty ports.

4. The right to examine textbooks for the purpose of suppressing anti-Japanese education by censoring any references to a United China and all derogatory facts about Japan despite possible historical accuracy.

The Chinese counter demands were outlined thus:
1. Immediate withdrawal of all Japanese blueprints thrown into the Shanghai area following the killing of a Japanese sailor and the wounding of two others two weeks ago.

2. Immediate withdrawal of Japanese troops holding Fengtai in North China. Japanese surrounded a Chinese garrison there and threatened war after an alleged attack on a Japanese. The Chinese garrison withdrew peacefully.

3. Suppression of all Japanese sponsored societies opposing constituted Chinese authorities, particularly a group indulging in smuggling in North China.

FOUR KILLED AS PLANE CRASHES

Motion Picture Airplane Cracks Up, Killing Four

Naperville, Ill. Sept. 30—Violent air currents set up by a speeding streamlined passenger train were believed responsible today for the crash of a motion picture airplane and the death of its four occupants.

The eight-passenger Lockheed Vega smashed into the ground yesterday afternoon as it swooped low over the Burlington road's crack "Zephyr" for motion pictures.

The dead:
Ralph Biddy, 36, cameraman for the Wilding picture productions, Detroit.
Howard Adams, 27, Chicago assistant director.
Wilma Schuesler, 24, Chicago, Script girl.
Oscar Hanold, 40, veteran Chicago transport pilot.

The plane took off from Chicago municipal airport and waited at Naperville for the train. As the train approached, the plane swung along

side, with Biddy working his camera through an open door. Hanold brought the ahi parocord for a rear-view "shot" just before it crashed.

Testimony of witnesses indicated the possibility of motor trouble. Although the plane had passed department of air commerce tests a week ago. It was believed powerful air currents sucked the ship to the ground, where it caught fire immediately.
