NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS

Notice is hereby given that Monday, May 1, 1937 will be the day to pay your Spring Installment of taxes. The county treasurer's office will be open from 8 A. M. to 4 P. M. during the tax paying season. All taxes not paid by that time will be compounded and an additional 5% will be added for each year tax remains unpaid from first Monday in November in the year the delinquency occurs. Those who have bought or sold property and wish to pay taxes are asked to come in at once.

Call on the Auditor for errors and any reductions. The Treasurer can make no corrections.

The treasurer will not be responsible for the penalty of delinquent taxes resulting from the omission of tax-payers to state definitely on what property the desire to pay, in whose name it may be found, in whose township or corporation it is situated.

Persons owing delinquent taxes should pay them at once, the law is such that there is no option left for the Treasurers but to enforce the collection.

County orders will not be paid to anyone owing delinquent taxes. All persons are warned against them.

Particular attention. If you pay taxes in more than one township mention this to the Auditor. He also says that you should call for all your real estate and personal property.

In making inquiries of the Treasurer regarding taxes to insure reply do not fail to include return postage.
