Decatur Obtains One Hit; Loses To Berne Friday, 7 To 0

The speedy hurling of Bob Dro, who but for a "scratch" his would have entered the hall of fame by pitching a no-hit, no-run game, proved too much for the Decatur Yellow Jackets nine Friday afternoon with the result that they fell before the Berne Bears, 7-0.

Dro, not content with holding the locals scoreless, dazzled them with his speed-ball, striking out 20 men in the seven innings. To prove his baseball ability, Dro clouted out a triple and a home run in an official three times at bat.

## COURT HOUSE

### Estate Cases
