SPECIAL RETURN FORMS PRINTED

State Prints Special Forms For Interstate Business Income

Indianapolis, June 18.—Special return forms on which manufacturers and others engaged in interstate business will report income from sales in interstate commerce will be issued soon by the Indiana gross income tax division, it was announced today by Clarence A. Jackson, director of the division.

Under a ruling issued this week, taxpayers will be permitted to continue to defer tax payments on interstate sales pending a decision by the United States supreme court on the right of the state to levy a gross income tax on such receipts.

Decision to continue the deferral privilege was made at a conference of state officials attended by Governor M. Clifford Townsend, who asserted he approved the plan because "it protects the state's interests but at the same

time provides the least possible inconvenience for taxpayers affected."

It was estimated that potential back taxes amounting to more than \$10,000,000 were involved.
