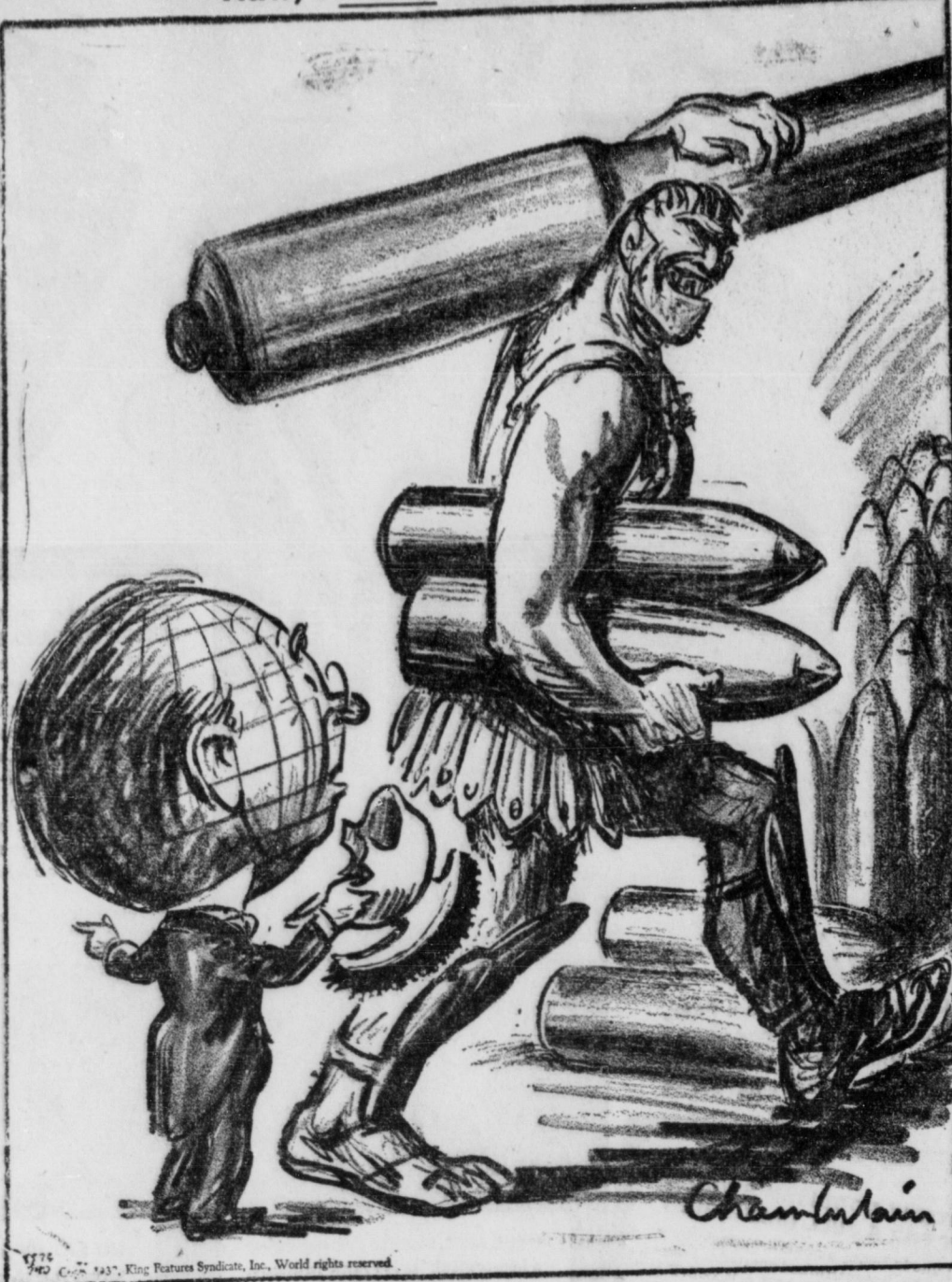

Of Fishing LicenseIndianapolis, July 12—There has  
been no change in the cost of the  
1937 combination fishing and hunt-  
ing license, the increase from \$1 to
