## JACKETS PLAY ON HOME FIELD FRIDAY NIGHT

### Decatur To Meet Central Catholic Here Friday Night

The Decatur Yellow Jackets, fresh from their first victory of the season last week at Portland, will play their second home game of the year Friday night.

The Jackets will play Central Catholic of Fort Wayne at Worthman Field, with the opening kickoff scheduled promptly at 8 o'clock.

Decatur and C. C. both defeated Portland by about the same margin, the Yellow Jackets winning by three touchdowns and Central Catholic by two touchdowns.

The Jackets showed considerable improvement in scoring a victory over Portland last Friday, although it must be remembered Portland has been exceedingly weak this season, having failed to score a point.

Coach Hugh Andrews is expected to start practically the same lineup that came through to victory at Portland.

## CHICAGO SOX DEFEAT CUBS

### Whitehead Hurls White Sox To Victory In City Series

Chicago, Oct. 14. — (U.P.) — The Chicago White Sox and the National league Cubs began to disband for the winter today with the Sox in possession of the city title for the fourth year in a row.

Big John Whitehead, who evened the series at two games each last week, scored his second victory yesterday before 12,457 at Wrigley field. Their 6-1 walkaway gave the Sox a 4 to 3 edge in the 1937 series.

Whitehead scattered nine Cub hits while the Sox wove seven into six runs off Solemn Curt Davis, the losing pitcher, and his relief man, Jim (Tex) Carleton.

The Cubs scored in the first inning when Frank Demaree singled home Stan Hack, who led off with a double. The Sox began to roll in the second inning when Rip Radcliff singled and Appling walked. Bonura forced Radcliff at third base but Jackie Hayes singled, scoring Appling. Bonura went to third on the play and scored on Sewell's outfield fly.

Radcliff's second single in the fourth, a double by Appling and two outfield flies produced two more Sox runs. Two walks and a single scored two more in the sixth and little Mike Kreevich topped it off with a homer in the seventh.

### Traynor Signed Again To Manage Pirates

Pittsburgh, Oct. 14. — (U.P.) — Harold (Pie) Traynor today signed a contract to manage the Pittsburgh Pirates ball club of the National league in 1938 and also revealed his first step in re-building the club.

Joining the Pirates in 1920 as a rookie third baseman, Traynor became manager of the Pittsburgh club in June, 1934.

His first deal in rebuilding the team was the purchase of outfielder John R. Rizzo, from the St. Louis Cardinals. Rizzo was obtained in exchange for catcher Tommy Padden, rookie first baseman Bernard Cobb and an unannounced sum of money.
