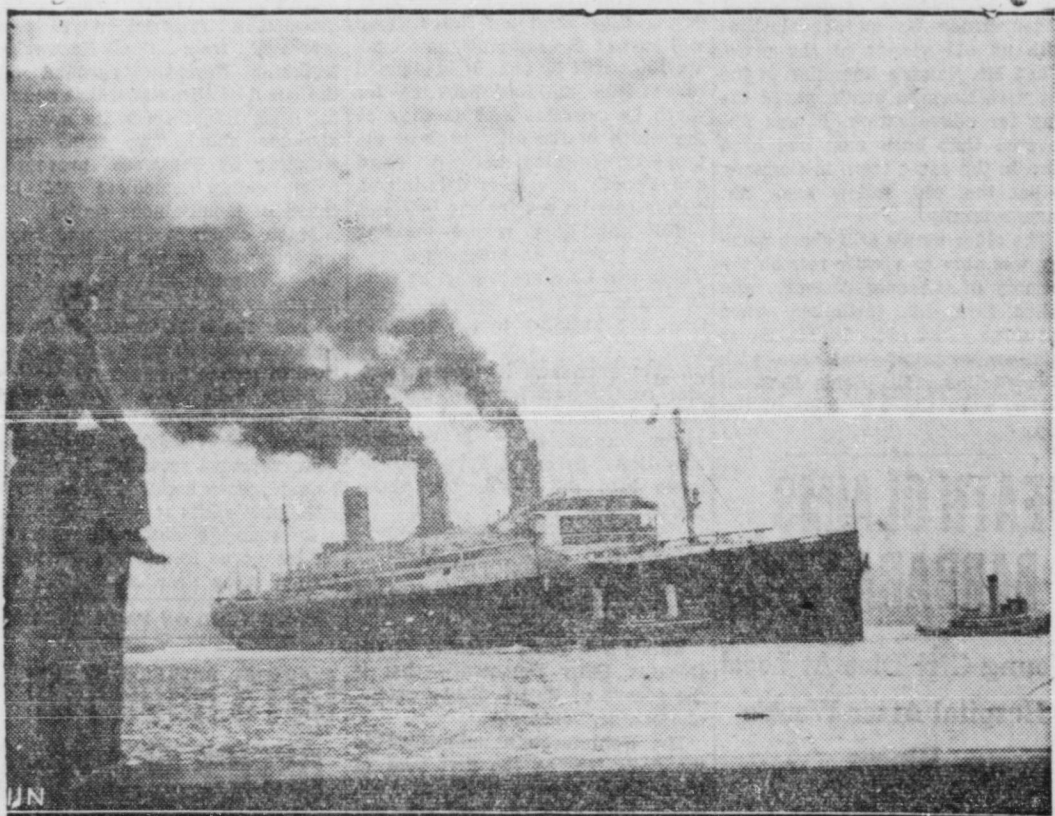
Eleanor Helps Celebrate Night Club Opening

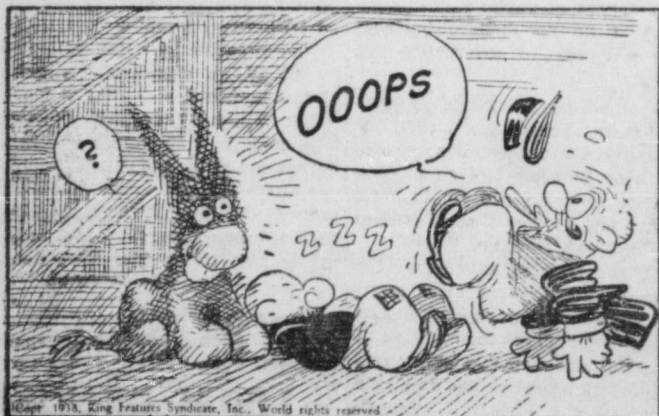

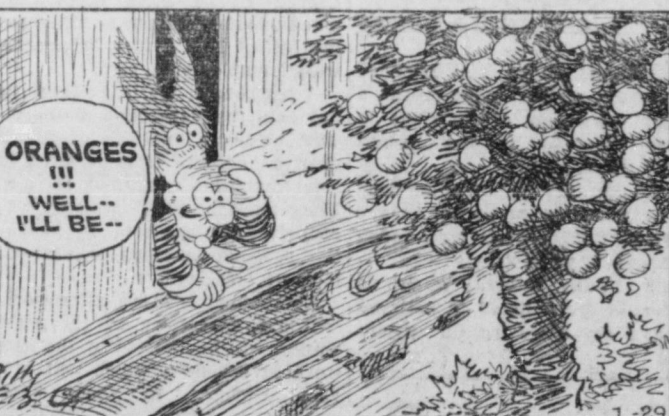
