Excise Funds Distributed

Adams County Receives Total Of \$2,861.23 In Distribution

Indianapolis, June 13 — Excise funds totalling \$409,697.52 were sent to 320 Indiana cities and towns in the semi-annual distribution June 1, Laurence F. Sullivan, state auditor, announced today.

In addition, township, city and town schools were sent checks totalling \$204,459.73, Mr. Sullivan said.

Each local governmental unit receives two-thirds of the total collected in that town for liquor, beer and wine retailer permits. Towns having no permittees who bought licenses during the previous six months receive none of that allotment.

Distribution to school treasuries, however, is made on the basis of average daily attendance, and is sent into every township in the state.

Adams county received a total of \$2,861.23. This was divided as follows:

Adams county schools — (township, city and town) — \$1,427.90.

Town or city governments: Decatur — \$950.00. Geneva — \$483.33.


