


Weather A Week Ahead

TEMPERATURE AND RAINFALL FOR INDIANA.

APRIL 3 to 9.

The East half of Indiana will be cool. Moderately warm over the Northwest and West central areas. Warmer in the Southwest portions. The greater part of Indiana will be wet, with moderately wet areas in the South central, East central and Northwest portions.

BRITISH WEATHER BLOCKADE

Weather in Germany is "made in England." The British in wartime, can stop all weather data regarding Germany until it is too late to be of military value.


Battles on land, sea and in the air are planned to fit weather conditions. Without such knowledge Germany would be at a serious disadvantage.

One of the first acts of the allies in 1914 was to shut off weather reports to Germany. Most European weather comes from the Atlantic Ocean, and in order to get to Germany it must first pass over Great Britain. The allies knew this, and they were careful that Germany didn't receive many weather reports. The effect of this air blockade was serious to Germany.

The British Meteorological Service is based on the synoptic system. It depends upon a great many stations and ships for its operation. The British Government issues a weather map of the northern hemisphere every day. In peace time this excellent service goes to everybody. In wartime British enemies would not get it. Britain and her allies can plan battles with a foreknowledge of the weather, while Germany and her allies must guess. When a battle on land, sea or air is being planned, the possible weather for those critical days must be
