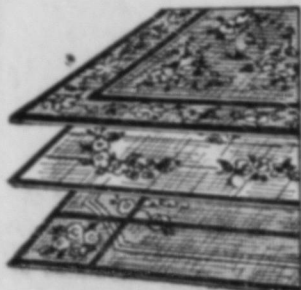

## PREXY LOSSES MOUNT HIGHER

### Market Plunging Of Miss- ing College Head Over \$430,000

Baton Rouge, La., June 29—(U.P.)—Losses in his final weeks of market plunging approximated \$430,000 for Dr. James Monroe Smith, fugitive former president of Louisiana state university. It was disclosed today by the brokerage firm which handled his accounts.

Charles Fenner, senior member of the firm of Fenner and Beane in New Orleans, made the revelation when he reported for call before an East Baton Rouge parish grand jury investigating the alleged embezzlements of Smith for whom \$2,750 reward has been offered.

Fenner told reporters that his first estimate of \$350,000 in losses by the "J. Monroe" (Smith) account was only a recollection and that later figures indicated that the losses would be nearer \$430,000.

If the figure is correct a balance of \$70,000 remains of the \$500,000 Smith was known to have borrowed under the university's name from three banks.

Fenner said that his firm had paid the Smith account, through intermediary broker J. M. Brown, a total of \$41,960.93 in two checks, June 15 and June 20.

Smith disappeared June 24, after tendering his resignation to the then Gov. Richard W. Leche.

Some officials believe that Smith may have the \$41,000 with him in his flight from the charges of embezzling \$100,000 of the university's money.

Brown, who testified for five hours before the grand jury yesterday, resumed his testimony today. Scheduled to appear next were Fenner and J. Emory Adams, nephew of Mrs. Smith who fled with her husband.

While the East Baton Rouge parish grand jury went deeper into the scandal left by Smith a police report from New Orleans said that the educator was believed to have maintained a suite in a New Orleans hotel under the name of a state official.
