


INDIANA'S LINCOLN MEMORIAL IMPRESSIVE IN SIMPLICITY



Approach to the Nancy Hanks Lincoln Grave

Around the grave of Nancy Hanks Lincoln and the site of the cabin in which the Lincoln family spent fourteen years on Hoosier soil, Indiana has created a memorial, impressive in its natural simplicity and a shrine of national importance.

This memorial will be the setting for the annual pilgrimage of the Indiana Lincoln Union, commemorating the anniversary of the birth of Abraham Lincoln, and during the year will be visited by thousands from all parts of the country, adjoining the memorial, with its thousand acres of wooded hills, a lake, picnic areas, trails and drives.

Located in Spencer county, near Lincoln City and accessible over improved highways from all directions, the memorial area and park have been developed by the Department of Conservation with the cooperation of the Indiana Lincoln Union and other interested individuals and groups. Much of the actual work was done by a camp of the Civilian Conservation Corps with the cooperation of the National Park service. Other federal work agencies have assisted in the program.

In the development of the memorial area and the establishment of the park especial care has been taken to retain and enhance the natural beauty while providing such facilities as are necessary for the visitors attracted. Virgil M. Simmons, commissioner of the Department of Conservation pointed out today. The grave is marked by a simple stone and protected by a low iron fence, erected years ago when interest was aroused in its preservation.

At the site of the cabin to which and where they lived while Abraham where they lived while Abraham grew to manhood, a marker resembling the foundation logs and the fireplace has been placed by the Lincoln Union. The original hearthstones, discovered during the placing of this marker, have been preserved and add to the interest.

OLD STAND-BY COOKIES

THE fancy cookies are fun—but for real enjoyment, is there anything more enjoyable than old-fashioned sugar-sprinkled molasses cookies—or the thin crispy "sugar" cookies with daintily scalloped edges and a raisin in the center of each? The raisin isn't necessary—nor are the scalloped edges. Those trimmings were put on when mother wanted to make them party cookies.

Both of these are good stand-by cookies for any and every occasion.

Soft Molasses Cookies

1½ cups shortening
1 cup sugar
6 cups all-purpose flour
2 tsp. soda
1 tsp. salt
1 tsp. allspice
1 tsp. ginger
1 tsp. cinnamon
1 cup dark molasses
1 cup cold coffee

Cream the shortening and add the sugar gradually. Add the well beaten eggs. Sift flour once before measuring. Sift together flour, baking powder and salt. Add to the creamed mixture alternately with the milk. Add the flavoring. Roll out dough as thin as possible. Cut with cookie cutter, sprinkle with sugar and bake 8 to 12 minutes (depending on thickness of cookies) in a moderately hot oven, 400° F. This makes 6 dozen cookies 3 inches in diameter.

Note: Chilling dough a few hours will make it possible to roll cookies very thin. Dough will be easier to handle with a cloth on the mixing board and a cover on the rolling pin.
