### News Of The World

Kuikhshevy (new Russian capital)—Special fighting zone dispatches said today that Hitler has thrown his paratrooper and air-transport forces into the Moscow front fighting in a desperate attempt to crush the living wall which has slowed the Nazi offensive.

Berlin—Nazi informants declared today that the German high command planned a slow encirclement of Moscow, meantime driving through the entire Donets river basin in the south.

Washington—Administration supporters appealed today for quick enactment of the armed ship resolution "to give our ships a chance." The toll of American-

erated ships lost in this war rose to 10 with the announcement of two sinkings yesterday.

Los Angeles—Two of the strongest earth tremors since the 1933 disaster at Long Beach shook southern California last night causing minor damage.

Rome—An Italian high command communique said today that British planes raided Naples for five hours during the night, killing 14 persons and wounding 27.

**New Physical Exam Plan For Draftees**  
Indianapolis, Oct. 22—(UP)—Lt. Col. Robinson Hitchcock, state selective service director, today announced the division of Indiana into five districts under the new physical examination plan.  
The plan calls for examination of selective service registrants 30 to 60 days prior to delivery to the Fort Benjamin Harrison reception center for induction into the army. Selectees will be certified to the army examining team by local board doctors on the basis of a cursory check-up and will be provided transportation to and from the examination center, the announcement said.  
The Fort Wayne area will include Adams, Allen, Blackford, DeKalbe, Elkhart, Grant, Huntington, Jay, Kosciusko, La Grange, Miami, Noble, Steuben, Wabash, Wells and Whitley counties.
