Norman Sweet Seeks G. O. P. Nomination

Fort Wayne, Ind., Oct. 27.—(UP)—Norman Sweet, who unsuccessfully sought the Republican nomination for fourth district congress-

man in the last election, today was the first candidate to toss his hat in the 1942 primary ring.

He announced his "fundamental issue was 'charity begins at home,' he said he was for a 'national defense in America, against AEF and any foreign entanglements, neutrality 100 percent, and cessation of lend-lease to England and Russia."
