Prevent Silver Tarnish

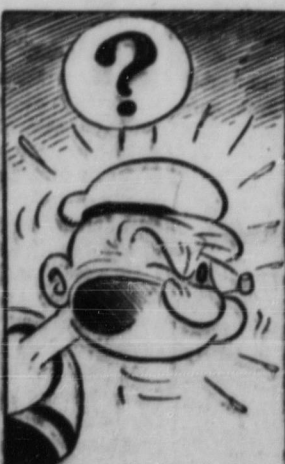
