

Seattle Sanitarium Fire Fatal To 30

Elderly Patients Victims Of Fire

Seattle, Feb. 1 (UPI)—A fire which started in the basement of the Lakeside sanitarium has taken the lives of 30 elderly patients.

Authorities say that a workman accidentally dropped a lit match into a pool of oil on the floor. The entire two-story building was engulfed in flames in three minutes.

Many of the victims were trapped in their beds.

The building was owned and operated by Mrs. Madame Westberg. It formerly was a long structure but had been converted with wings.

Those present, it is reported, fought the blaze for two hours before firemen brought it under control.

A house across the street was burned into a glorified station, but no survivors were taken from that.



are pursuing the enemy to the west, and unofficial dispatches say eighth army vanguards already have crossed the Tunisian frontier at two points along the coastal road.

In the Mediterranean a British corvette has sunk an Italian submarine, torpedo-carrying. Allied planes have scored direct hits on an enemy destroyer and American heavy bombers have pounded the Italian base at Messina, on the island of Sicily.

under discussion include an increase from the \$5,000 paid the state superintendent of parks in 1942. Proponents of the wage increase call attention to the fact that the superintendent now receives less than most city superintendents and \$2,500 less than the director of the state high school

athletic association.

Republican spokesmen claim the secretary of state's salary also is out of line. That officer receives \$6,500 annually while the state auditor and state treasurer draw \$7,500. The proposed plan calls for an increase of \$1,000 per year for the secretary of state.

A bill already introduced in the legislature would raise the salaries of the three tax board members from \$1,000 to \$1,000 annually. The amount is the same drawn by members of the public service commission and the alcoholic beverage commission. Similar action also is contemplated to raise the salaries of the highway commission members from \$5,200 to \$6,000.

Re-Convene

Indianapolis, Feb. 1 (UPI)—Both branches of the Indiana legislature will reconvene this afternoon to begin the third full week of their current session. The principal matter of business confronting the lawmakers this week is the budget measure, which is expected to be placed on the governor's desk today or Tuesday. From there it will go to the general assembly. Indications are that the legislature will meet on six days instead of the usual five this week to speed up the flow of legislative action which has lagged behind the schedule set by leaders of both parties at the outset of the session.

A crush of legislation is awaited in the house of representatives in view of the lower chamber's 30-day deadline for the introduction of special and local bills. It is problematical whether the senate also will adopt a 30-day rule similar to the house's restriction. The senate now permits bills to be introduced during the first 45 days.
