## Japanese Officers Sentenced To Death

San Francisco, Jan. 7.—(UP)—An Australian military court at Labuan, North Borneo, sentenced today Japanese officers to death today after finding them guilty of responsibility for the deaths of 820 Australian and British prisoners of war, Melbourne radio reported.

A "Capt. Takakura," officer formerly in command of a prisoner of war camp, was sentenced to death by hanging, and his adjutant, a "Capt. Watabe" was sentenced to be shot, Melbourne radio said in a broadcast heard by United Press.

## Post Treatment

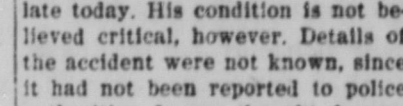
Scientists of the USDA have developed a method by which farmers and other users of wood-lot trees can introduce chemicals into the sap stream of the wood to increase the length of service of fence posts, bean poles, garden stakes, and other utility poles. The method is neither difficult nor expensive. The fresh-cut saplings are allowed to stand in a wooden tub or trough containing the right amount of chemical in solution for about six hours or until they have taken up the required amount of chemical. Tops of the saplings are supported by leaning them against a tree, building or other support.

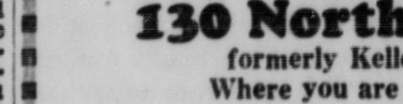
