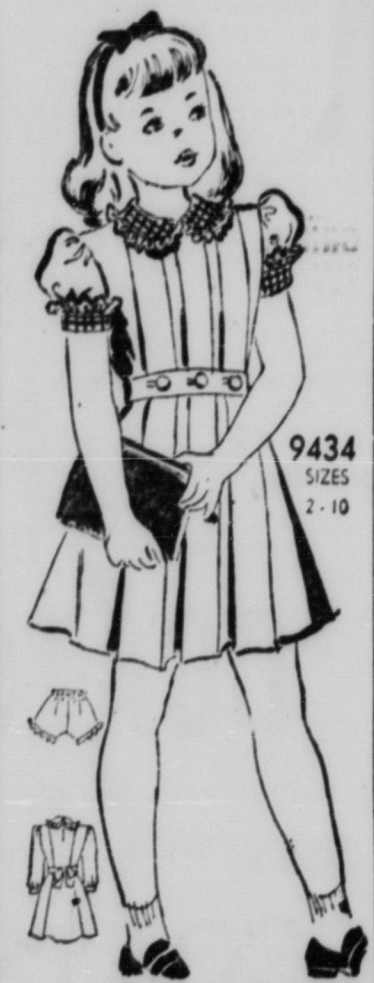

The Fort Wayne social security office reports that 222 persons, past 65 years of age, who have retired from active employment, are drawing retirement benefits.

Monthly benefits paid to them total \$3,547.14. The Fort Wayne office issued the following statement: "No doubt a number of benefit payments are lost by persons because they have delayed filing or failed to file a claim for their benefits. Contact with this office should be made when a worker nears the age of 65, and a call should be made by a member of the family when the worker dies."

Bottleg Distillers Costly To Treasury

French Lick, Ind., Oct. 24—(UP)—Indiana wholesale liquor dealers were told today that the United States treasury loses millions of dollars each year through illicit operations of bootleg distillers.

Carroll E. Mealey, deputy commissioner of the bureau of internal revenue, told a convention of the Indiana wholesale liquor dealers' association that, in addition to the

loss in tax dollars, the treasury is forced to spend hundreds of thousands of dollars each year in tracking down illicit stills—most of them operated in dry counties and states.
