member asserted that Greene and Brown "deserved every consideration, especially in view of the fact that they had served in the war and fought for their country." To this Rev. Richardson interposed the query, "What did they fight for?" Greene and Brown immediately chorused "For you."

Greene later spoke briefly, contending that the establishment of his proposed tavern would not endanger the welfare of the town's citizens, averring "it would be better for them to drink in Geneva than to drive over to Ohio and get their drinks, as some of the people in that group could tell you" — referring to the demonstrators.

Members of the board informed Rev. Richardson that he and his group had the right to appear in protest when the other tavern's license renewal is set for a hearing after several deplorable conditions which they said resulted from that place of business.

Shortly after the meeting was dismissed, the board voted on the application and approved it. Local members of the board, Henry Dehner, James Elbertson and I. Bernstein, stated that since there had been no infraction of the law and the application was in order, the approval was granted.

Geneva's population is now less than 1,000, the Rev. Richardson stated.

Previous to hearing this application, which was held in the courtroom because of the number of interested persons, the board approved without objection the following renewals:

Knights of Columbus lodge, represented by Fred Baker, beer and wine permit; Mirror Inn, represented by Bernard Clark, beer, wine and liquor; Frickie's Place, represented by Fred Fullenkamp, beer, wine and liquor; Riverview Gardens, represented by Charles Davis, beer, wine and liquor.

county steel mill cities and possibly Terre Haute.

Tabulations were incomplete in Vigo county (Terre Haute), but Townsend was leading Jenner there in a relatively close race. Townsend carried lake county by about 2,000 votes.

Other cities—Indianapolis, South Bend, Anderson, Evansville, Fort Wayne and Muncie—went Republican.

The "scratch" vote was unusually heavy and may have set a record in the cities.

In Marion county, the GOP state ticket won by more than 20,000 votes but the Republican nominee for congress, Albert J. Beveridge, Jr., lost by 4,000 to Rep. Louis Ludlow, a Democrat and dean of the Hoosier congressional delegation.

The scratch picture was similar elsewhere. In numerous counties,

Indiana's Oldest Public Official Dies

New Albany, Ind., Nov. 7—(UP)—Indiana's oldest public official, 89-year-old George Bates of New Albany, died within a few hours after he had been elected to a fifth term as Floyd county assessor.

Bates, a Republican, became ill Sunday and his condition on election day was too critical to permit him to vote. He died early yesterday without learning that voters gave him 6,800 votes to 6,233 for his Democratic opponent, Russell J. Payne.

came from Sen. J. William Fulbright, D. Ark., and the new deal Chicago Sun. The Atlanta Constitution said the Democrats should give "very serious" consideration to Fulbright's proposal.

Proponents of a presidential switch felt that since a majority of voters has changed political sides, Mr. Truman should appoint a Republican secretary of state and then resign.

Republican national chairman B. Carroll Reece's reaction was that it was "a matter between the president and his conscience."

Republican leaders generally displayed no enthusiasm for the proposal. As things stand, they feel sure of winning the presidency in 1948 for four full years.

Always in the past when an anti-administration party has taken control of congress in an off year, it has gone on to win the ensuing presidential election.
