Local Lady's Mother Dies In New York

Word has been received here of the recent death of Mrs. Mary Penz, mother of Mrs. Robert Wenhoff, who died March 21 in a New York City hospital. She moved from Decatur 30 years ago.

The 15 men apparently had made no effort to brattice the doors of the worked-out coal room in which they were found. Dying Miners Wrote Notes To Families

Some Miners Lived Over Half A Day

Centralla, Ill., March 31 —(UP)—Without hysterics or heroics, 15 of the Centralla coal mine's 111 victims waited more than half a day to be rescued from the 540 foot gas-blasted pit, and then scribbled farewell notes to their wives and families, it was revealed today.

The notes were found in the pockets of the men, who lay down to die in an underground room approximately a mile from the center of last Tuesday's explosion.

The last of the notes — timed off at 6:30 a.m. Wednesday — said: "It is seeping in on us."

The writer referred to the deadly blanket of monoxide gas which spread through the tunnel after the 3:30 p.m. blast.

Written on scraps of paper which had served as sandwich wrappers and on small sheets torn from a pocket note book, the brief messages were mostly instructions for clearing up personal affairs, declarations of love, and a plea from one miner that his wife make sure their children attended church regularly.

Rescuers found the men lying in the room as if they had merely stopped for a rest before proceeding to the shaft and safety. One miner had rolled his coat into a pillow and curled up on the hard floor.

A large note, lying on the floor, told rescuers there were "notes in our pockets." "Give to our wives."

Centralla was in deep mourning today. Church bells tolled throughout the morning and afternoon as one funeral procession followed another through the streets, keeping to a rather rapid schedule arranged by the churches and funeral directors.

All but the most essential businesses were closed here, as they were in four surrounding communities.

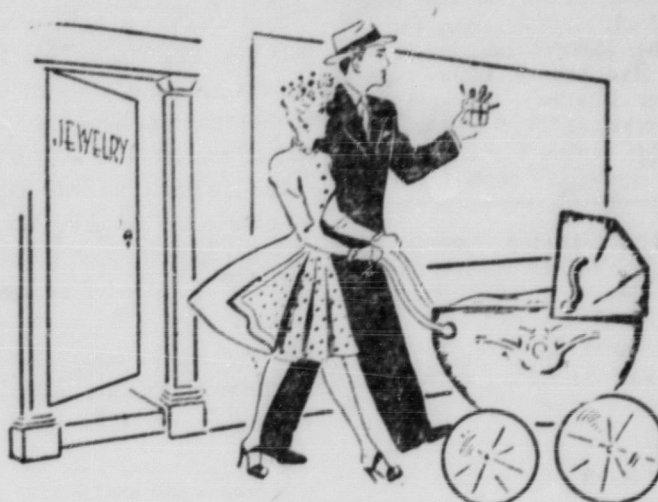

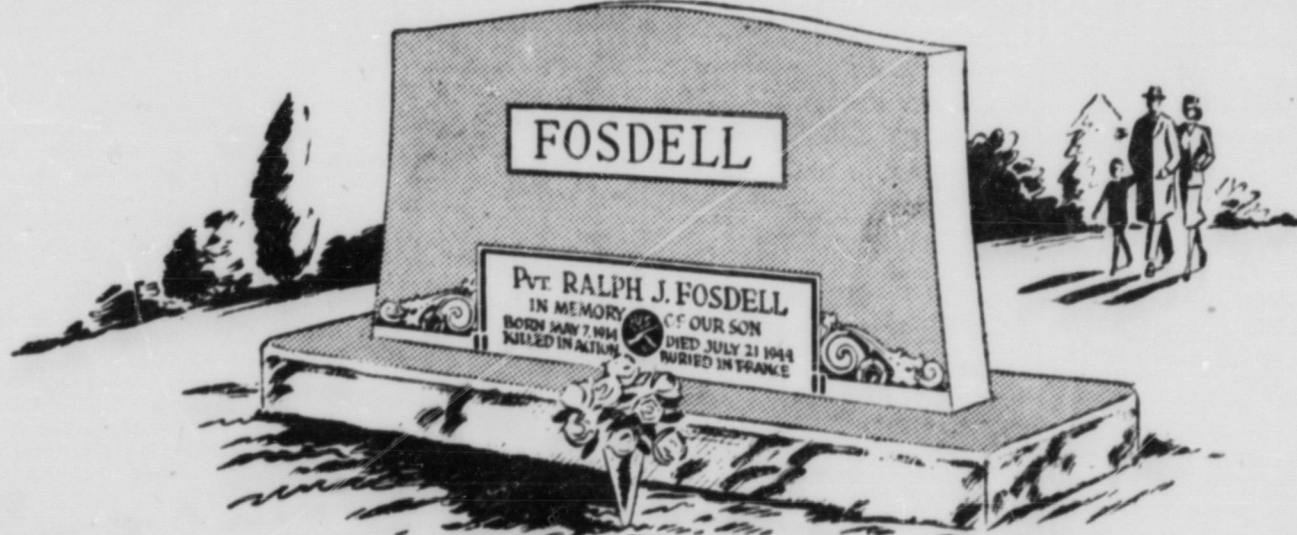
