

Northern Palestine Under Martial Law

Limited Decree Is Ordered By British

Jerusalem, Feb. 5—(UP)—British authorities declared limited martial law in northern Palestine today in the wake of a Jewish demand that the United Nations approve formation of a Jewish militia to guard the entire Holy Land, including Arab areas.

Under the new decree, announced by the military commander of upper Galilee, residents of the Tiberias area around the Sea of Galilee were prohibited from leaving their homes starting at 8 a.m.

The restrictions were clamped down only a few hours after a new Arab invasion of north Palestine yesterday near Rosh Pina, seven miles north of the Sea of Galilee on the Palestine-Syrian frontier.

The British army confirmed a Palestine government report that the invaders were garbed in Syrian army uniforms and carried French army rifles. Syria formerly was under French rule.

The government report said British troops repelled the invasion, killing one Arab and capturing six. The Jewish militia Haganah claimed that 12 Arabs were killed and eight taken prisoner.

The British also announced a second Arab border crossing last night. The Arabs entered Palestine on the Jisr Majami railway bridge south of the Sea of Galilee and attacked Jewish settlement police guarding crops at the Geshner settlement.

David Ben Gurion, head of the Jewish agency and premier-designate of the new Jewish state, asserted British authorities were unable to keep law and order and asked that the task be entrusted to a Jewish militia under control of the United Nations commission on Palestine.

He said the Jews were ready to undertake the security of all Palestine if necessary and demanded that Jews be given the right to purchase arms on the same basis as the Arab states.

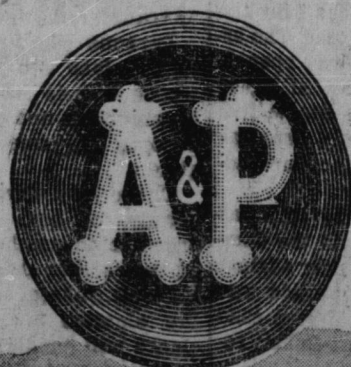
