## Lower For Quarter

## Market Conditions Cause Profit Drop

A second quarter profit of \$808,846.09 has been announced by Central Soya Co., Inc., on sales for that period of \$24,031,775 or 12.3 percent profit per share on 660,000 outstanding. This represents 3.37 percent profits on sales for that period.

Erratic market conditions and high costs of livestock and poultry feeds, based directly on high commodity prices prior to the market break in January and February, were reflected in a profit drop.

from the comparative period of last year, according to R. H. Fletcher, president. The corresponding three months of 1947 showed a company profit of \$1,307,317 or 6.73 percent on sales.

Profits for the first half were \$1,884,803 or 4.92 percent of sales. Provision for state and federal taxes for the six month period total \$1,134,178.

The livestock and poultry feed division of the company, McMillen Feed Mills, operates plants in this city, Gibson City, Ill., Harrisburg, Pa., Marion, O., and Memphis, Tenn.

Whether any of the other plants will go into production depends largely upon the decision of congress on the military budget. The present program calls for a "beefed-up" 55 group program.

Some congressional leaders believe it should be expanded to a 70 group force.

The five plants withdrawn from surplus are:

Boeing plant at Wichita, Kan., with a peak wartime employment of 30,000 workers. One large hangar on the flight line will be reopened immediately for modernization of B-29 bombers, with employment of about 4,000 skilled workers.

Aircraft assembly plant at Cleveland, O., standby.

Curtiss Wright plant at Lockland, O., standby.

Aircraft assembly plant No. 3 Tulsa, Okla.

North American at Kansas City (to continue under a seven-year lease to General Motors).

These plants will be kept under air force ownership. They may be leased out to private industry but only under conditions that they will be turned back immediately in a national emergency.

Former assembly plants at Omaha, Neb., and Marietta, Ga., are being used jointly by the air force and navy for storage of machine tool equipment. They also are being held on a standby status.

The air force denied reports that it has stopped all declaration of planes and engines to the war assets administration for sale to surplus. It has only withdrawn from surplus a few engine types on which it had not properly estimated its needs.

The only plane withdrawn from surplus is the Curtiss Commando C-46. Engines and spare parts for that plane have also been withdrawn. The air force is leasing this type plane to commercial airlines.

and the United States on the one hand, and Germany on the other, was unbroken."

Describing Cardinal Spellman as "an inveterate reactionary and passionate enemy of the Soviet Union," the broadcast said that a book entitled "The Vatican Against The Twentieth Century," which was published in Britain last year, told of the prelates at the Vatican in 1943.

The book said, according to Moscow, that he met Baron Ernst Von Weizsaecker, deputy of foreign minister Joachim Von Ribbentrop, there, and that Von Ribbentrop also was in Rome at that time.

The broadcast said the "centers of separate negotiations" between Britain and the United States and Germany during the war were neutral capitals—Berlin, Madrid, Lisbon, Ankara

and the Vatican."

Listing alleged contacts of this kind, the broadcast repeated previous Russian charges concerning Allen W. Dulles, whom it identified as "chief of American intelligence in Switzerland," and Max Aitken, son of British publisher Lord Beaverbrook.
