On motion of plaintiff, the divorce action filed by Arthur G. Fellers vs. Dorothy L. Fellers was dismissed and costs paid.

Estate Cases

Final report was filed by Catherine Brunnegraff, administratrix of the Joseph B. Brunnegraff estate, showing receipts of \$2,782.38 and expenses of \$1,124.43, net assets \$1,657.95. Distribution to the widow and three children was made.

Inventory in the estate of Jacob C. Barkley was filed by Elva M. Barkley, administratrix. Real estate was appraised at \$17,500; bonds, cash and shares in Monroeville Equity and Adams County Farm Bureau, \$14,892.98; household goods and grains, \$2,059.24. Claims were listed at \$2,439.79 and net value at \$32,012.43. The widow and children inherit the estate.

Final report was filed in the Judge J. Fruchte estate, showing appraised value of \$43,243.68 and claims of \$4,056.61. A distribution of \$5,734.80 equally between the widow, Lulu Fruchte, and a daughter, Harriet Cowan, was made from cash receipts and proceeds from sale of government bonds. James Cowan is administrator of the estate and hearing on report will be held June 18.

Poll Shows Dewey Leads Candidates

GOP Preparing For National Convention

Philadelphia, June 15—(UP)—The Republican national convention arrangements committee met today for last minute adjustment of plans for the big show which begins next Monday.

Advance men for the candidates are on the ground. Each is claiming victory for his man and none is too busy to take a clot at President Truman. Rep. Clarence J. Brown, of Ohio, Taft-for-president manager, snatched his coat for a kickoff press conference. He said Sen. Robert A. Taft could come up with 312 votes on the first convention ballot if necessary.

Herbert Brownell, one of Gov. Thomas E. Dewey's three campaign managers, countered from his headquarters that the governor would lead on the first ballot. Brownell did not say how many votes his man would have on No. 1.

Chairman Carroll Reece of the Republican national committee opened the ball last night with a radio address denouncing the president.

"Mr. Truman is playing the kind of politics he understands," Reece said on a national hook-up. "The kind he learned under the tutelage of the Pendergast machine (Kansas City, Mo.) which first sent him to the senate and to which he still owes allegiance as a dues paying member."

A Gallup poll of Republican party members showed Dewey leading the list as a favorite presidential candidate.

"When a candidate leads in delegates and is shown by that poll to be the choice of the rank and file," Brownell said, "he will be hard to beat."

Some favorite son and dark horse headquarters are beginning to open here. But the only place already full of bustling activity is the Stassen-for-president headquarters in Walnut street. Harold E. Stassen and his family are due here Thursday. He is bringing the children.

Early Outbreaks Of Polio Are Reported

Declares Outbreaks Are Not 'Alarming'

New York, June 15—(UP)—Outbreaks of infantile paralysis, which have reached most serious proportions in Texas, North Carolina and Idaho, have brought the total number of cases this year to 1,227, or 20 percent above last year's figure for the same months, the national foundation of infantile paralysis said today.

Dr. H. M. Weaver, director of research for the foundation, said the outbreaks could not be considered "alarming."

Texas has reported the greatest number of cases—342 as compared with 59 for the same period last year and a 1947 total of 183, the foundation said. Cases appeared to be centered at Edinburg, near the state's southeastern tip, and Houston.

Idaho has reported 41 cases to date as compared with 12 for the same period last year. The state had a total of 352 cases in last year's epidemic.

In North Carolina, 110 cases have been reported as compared with 18 for the same date last year and a 1947 total of 297.

Weaver said that, with the exception of Texas, the outbreaks appeared to be unusually early. A high incidence of polio generally is not expected until after hot, dry weather arrives.

Other states showing an increase in cases over the same period in 1947, Weaver said, include Indiana, with 28 as compared with 18 up to June 5 last year; Iowa, 52 against 14; New Jersey, 31 against 13; Oregon, 20 against 8; South Carolina 13 against 4; Washington, 28 against 15; North Dakota, 119 against 18, and South Dakota, 21 against 2.

The Los Angeles area has reported 153 cases, the foundation said. The area had 273 cases during all of 1947.

Polio equipment pools have been located in San Antonio; Denver, Atlanta, Columbus, O., Boston, and Portland, Ore., the foundation said, to facilitate shipment of necessary treatment materials to affected areas.

Plan Conferences On Vets' Benefits

Plans for a series of state-wide conferences, designed to inform Indiana veterans and officers of state service organizations of veteran's state and federal benefits, were announced today by the veterans administration here.

The conferences will be sponsored by the VA, the American Legion, the state department of veterans affairs, the Disabled American Veterans, the Red Cross and the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

In this area the meeting will be held in Fort Wayne at the Purdue Center at 7:30 o'clock on June 29.

consolidation, the school board having passed a resolution favoring the merger, and no remonstrance was filed against it.

In French township, however, a remonstrance was filed after favorable action was taken by the advisory board, therefore making an election necessary.

Trustee Graber stated that his chief interest was a fair election and one in which the expression of every resident of the township could be ascertained. He has urged all eligible persons to cast their vote the way they see fit.

Residents of Monroe and Kirkland township have been thrown into the argument. Those interested from these two townships hope that the merger plan will be defeated, thereby making possible a school merger of French, Monroe and Kirkland townships.

Ballots are being printed this week in the Daily Democrat office, and the printing will be supervised, just as in any election. The official ballots will be white and the samples will be green.

The question will be stated on the ballot so that a person voting "For" will vote for the Berne-French merger; those voting "Against" will be voting against the proposed consolidation. This is in accordance with the law.
