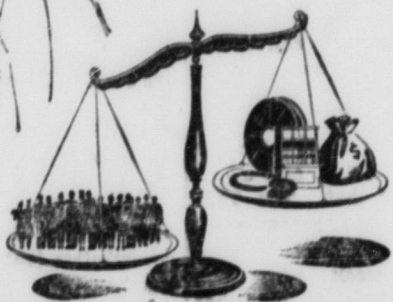

This time they are traveling cross-country in a station wagon. Ned Kennedy and Cecil Cary, who traveled from the state of Washington on horse-back last year across the country to Washington, D. C. and New York City, are on their way home, but are riding in more comfort on their return trip.

Yesterday, the cowboys who gained national fame with their unusual mode of travel in the atomic age, stopped in Decatur. They were riding in a brand-new station wagon of popular make, with a trailer attached, headed for the west coast.

They stopped at the Elks club, where last December they were greeted by Decatur Elks. The two men related the highlights of their horseback ride to a group of men.

Kennedy and Cary visited the White House and were welcomed by President Truman, who, after talking with the open-air, horseback riding tourists, stepped outside to take a look at their horses. In Old New York, where the 10 million inhabitants are accustomed to seeing channel swimmers, around the world fliers, presidents and potentates, the riding cowboys, were royally received and entertained.

The men intend to make another trip across the country this year. They will travel northward through Canada and then cut south, hoping to be in Florida by the time blizzards and snow flurries infest other sections of the country.
