Plan New Policy On Armed Forces' Reds

Forrestal Orders Uniform Policies
Washington, Sept. 2 — (UP) — Defense secretary James Forrestal has ordered a joint committee of the army, navy and air force to work out a new and uniform policy on Communists in the armed forces, it was disclosed today.

The move was prompted in part by the decision of selective service officials not to bar Communists. They feared such a step would encourage some youths to embrace Communism to escape the draft.

The various branches of the armed services for some time have had their own methods for preventing Communists from worming their way into sensitive posts where they might have access to secret information.

In most cases, party members are given menial duty and are placed under constant surveillance to make sure they do not try to spread Communist doctrine.

Defense sources said the new policy may call for the discharge of all known Communists. They said the articles of war authorize such dismissals.

There was no indication when the special committee will complete its work.

The army, navy and air force, meanwhile, have undertaken a campaign to teach their recruits the goals of Communism.

The recruit is taught that Communism is the direct opposite of democracy and that Communists advocate the violent overthrow of the U. S. government. In addition, he is instructed how to recognize Communist propaganda as such.

Southern Democrats Warned By McGrath

Warns Dixiecrats Are Fourth Party

Southern congressional candidates were warned today that they cannot be Dixiecrats and Democrats at the same time.

Democratic national chairman J. Howard McGrath said in Washington that nominally Democratic office-seekers must either support President Truman's campaign for election or else stop regarding themselves as members of the Democratic party.

He said candidates in the south will "automatically" be withdrawing from the party if they spurn the national Truman-Harkley ticket for the Dixiecrat slate of Gov. J. Strom Thurmond of South Carolina and Gov. Fielding Wright of Mississippi.

The Dixiecrats are a fourth party in this campaign, he said, and their supporters are "leaving the Democratic party just as effectively as if they supported the Republicans or Henry Wallace's progressive party."

Other political developments: Dewey — GOP presidential nominee Thomas E. Dewey and Harold E. Stassen worked in Albany on the speech Stassen will give in Detroit next Tuesday in answer to President Truman's campaign-opening address there on Labor Day. Participating in the talks were Sen. Henry Cabot Lodge, R., Mass., and Elliott Bell, one of Dewey's top-ranking speech writers.

Texas — Complete returns from last Saturday's primary showed that former Gov. Coke Stevenson obtained 362 votes more than Rep. Lyndon Johnson in their race for the U. S. senate seat of retiring Sen. W. Lee O'Daniel. The results are not official yet.

Taylor — Sen. Glen Taylor, Henry Wallace's running mate, suffered a fate similar to Wallace's in North Carolina when he was bombarded with rotten eggs and peaches in Rexburg, Idaho. Taylor was not hit.

Tobin — Secretary of labor Maurice J. Tobin asked New York's liberal party to support President Truman's campaign for election. GOP — Republican campaign manager Herbert Brownell, Jr., appointed Barak T. Mattingly of St. Louis, general counsel for the GOP national committee, as director of the labor activities of the Dewey-Warren campaign.

August Temperature Near Normal At Berne

Berne, Sept. 2 — The temperature here during the month of August was about normal, with the mean average for the month being 72.2 degrees, according to H. M. Reusser, local weather observer. The 35-year average here is 72.1 degrees. The warmest day during the month saw the mercury go to 97 degrees, the lowest reading was 49. Rainfall was below normal with precipitation of only 1.76 during the month.
