## Church To Observe 75th Anniversary

St. Paul Lutheran  
Service On Sunday

The 75th anniversary of the founding of St. Paul's Lutheran church, near Preble, will be observed Sunday in three services. English service, 8:45 a.m., German service at 2:30 p.m. Two former pastors of the congregation will be the festival speakers. Rev. Adolf Koehler of Janesville, Minn., who served the congregation from 1942-1946 will speak in the morning services. Rev. W. H. Moeller of Van Wert, Ohio, will occupy the pulpit in the afternoon service. Rev. Moeller was the pastor of St. Paul's from 1936-1942. The pastor of the church, Rev. O. C. Busse, will be the brazier in these services. Special music will be offered by the organist, F. C. Schmiege, and the choir under the direction of Mr. Schmiege will enhance the services with a number of anthems. The ladies' organizations of the church will serve a luncheon in the church basement after the afternoon service.

St. Paul's is a daughter church of Zion Lutheran church, Friedheim. For six years the congregation was served by pastors of the Friedheim church. In 1879 Rev. G. Spiegel was called as the first resident pastor of the congregation. Under his pastorate the present church edifice was erected. Prior to this the congregation had worshipped in a small school house which had been erected at the time of the organization of the congregation. The present church building was completely renovated at a cost of \$33,000 in 1945.

The present officers of the congregation are: Rev. O. C. Busse, pastor; F. C. Schmiege, teacher and secretary; Rudolph Linneemann, elder; Gustav Koennemann, elder; Oswald Hoffmann, deacon; Albert Ewell, deacon; Robert Koenemann, deacon; Herman Bittner, deacon; William Macke, trustee; Gilbert Ellerding, trustee; William Selking, trustee.

The public is invited to these anniversary services.


