Plan Advertising For Lutheran Rally Here

Dr. Walter A. Maier
Here On November 14

Representatives of 10 Lutheran churches met in the parish rooms of Zion Lutheran church, West Monroe and Eleventh streets, to discuss advertising plans for the coming Lutheran hour rally, to be held at the local high school auditorium, Sunday, November 14. Louis Jacobs, chairman of the central publicity committee, presided at the meeting.

The Decatur rally will be sponsored by the Decatur-Van Wert zone of the Lutheran laymen's league and promises to bring to the high school auditorium one of the largest audiences ever to assemble in the city. The Lutheran hour speaker, Dr. Walter A. Maier, draws an estimated 25 million listeners to the radio every Sunday, and Dr. Maier's presence at the local rally will bring friends and followers from a radius of 25 miles.

At the planning meeting, the Rev. Edgar Schmidt, pastor of the local Zion Lutheran church, and Frank C. Schmiege, superintendent of the parochial school at St. Paul's Lutheran church of Preble, were assigned the task of submitting news articles and forms for space advertising to the nine daily and weekly newspapers covering the areas represented by the congregations sponsoring the rally. Herman Krueckeberg, chairman of the Decatur-Van Wert zone of the Lutheran laymen's league, reported the names of the various committees in charge of the rally.

GOP "riper" legislation designed
to strip the executive office of
its constitutional rights."

Schricker said Creighton helped
override Schricker's veto of the
legislation, which was later declared
unconstitutional. If Creighton
wins the election "by some remote
chance," Schricker said, he would
be able to exercise the rights of
the governor's office that Schricker
made possible by his fight against
the bill Creighton supported to
shear the office of power.

Governor Gates renewed his at-
tack on Schricker in an Indiana-
apolis speech, challenging the former
governor to match Creighton's
legislative accomplishments.

While the candidates were busy
state Republican headquarters
were preparing for a Saturday visit
at Rensselaer from Gov. Thomas
E. Dewey and indicating the possi-
bility Dewey might stop at
Hammond and South Bend.

And state Democratic leaders

were putting the finishing touches
on plans for President Truman's
rear platform appearance this
weekend at Hammond, North Indiana,
Logansport, Kokomo, Tipton, Noblesville,
and World War Memorial Cemetery
night.
