Governor Henry F. Schricker, whose term of office ends tomorrow, leaves his duties with the good will of an entire State. He has been a great wartime Governor. The reason is that, above everything else, he has kept close to the people. He has been the people's Governor.

There was no instance during his four-year term when he declined to help in the advancement of any worthy public cause if it was humanly possible for him to do so. He attended war activities, meetings in every county in the State. His ability to speak fluently, appropriately and convincingly has been surpassed rarely, if ever, in the history of Hoosier public life. Again the reason probably is that he stayed so close to the people.

Despite the stress of wartime, Governor Schricker has directed the complicated affairs of state government smoothly. Various commissions have come to Indiana to get a first-hand glimpse of how Governor Schricker and the institution officials were able to maintain such excellent service in the face of harassing conditions.

As for the gentle and gracious wife of the Governor, we can only say again what we have said so often: "She is our idea of an ideal First Lady."

Viewing the whole range of the Governor's stewardship, The Star congratulates Indiana on its good fortune of having Henry Schricker at the helm of State government during these last four years.

Regional Meeting

Roy McCorkel, graduate of the college of Wooster and of Yale divinity school will be the speaker on the afternoon and evening, November 14, for the regional youth fellowship meeting of the Evangelical and Reformed churches at the Cross Reformed church in Berne. He has travelled around the world—taught in college in India, travelled in England, on the continent, and into Russia; attended the world conference of the churches at Oxford and the world Christian youth conference in Amsterdam, Holland. He is the editor of "Voices from the Younger Churches." He is a member of the American arbitration association, and a member of board of directors of the Swarthmore Cooperative. In 1943 McCorkel became associate secretary of the American Friends service committee. He has had the direction of the institutes of international relations sponsored by the American Friends service committee. This summer McCorkel directed the international service seminar in Saarjari, Finland, and was dean of the international service seminar in Berlin, Germany. He also travelled in France and England.

He will speak on "personal attitudes towards war" in the afternoon and "What we can do about world order" in the evening.

Whether they knew what to do with them or not, the Russians did get a lot of atomic secrets. The big secret is how much atomic explosive—the "critical assembly"—has to be brought suddenly together for an explosion to take place.

Groves said frankly, "I don't know that the Russians got any information about the critical assembly; I don't know that they didn't."
