Mine Owners Blamed
For Kentucky Blast

Washington, Nov. 22 — (UP) — The U. S. Bureau of Mines blames failure of mine owners to correct "dangerous" working conditions for the 1945 mine explosion at Four-mile, Ky. The blast killed 25 miners. The report said the Straight Creek Mining Co. had been warned in August, 1945, of poor ventilation that permitted explosive methane gas to collect. On Dec. 25, it said, the gas was ignited by a spark from a type of fan on the bureau's "unsafe" list.


