Ton Litter Entries Deadline Is May 15

Lafayette, Ind., May 2 — Deadline for entries in the spring Hoosier ton litter club has been set for May 15, according to E. C. Miller, extension animal husbandryman, Purdue University. Last year approximately 1,000 litters were enrolled and from reports of the numbers of litters on Indiana farms this spring indications are that the 1949 enrollment should equal or surpass previous years.

Membership is open to every swine raiser in Indiana. Nomination cards for the litter are secured at the county agricultural agent office. Litters nominated must be farrowed in January, February, March or April. The litters can be either grades, purebreds or crossbreds, and must be raised alone or in the regular herd. The weight of the litter at 175 days is the reported weight.
