
## TRY AND THE U. S. STEEL CORPORATION

Nathan said profits, productivity, and return on investment had increased much faster than worker income during the last 10 years. His report said profits of 19 big basic steel companies in 1948 were nearly five times their 1939 profits. It said the industry's profits after taxes rose from \$131,000,000 in 1939 to \$624,000,000 in 1948.


