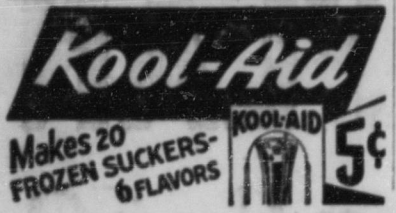

## Jobless Survey In Census This Month

### Determine Extent Of Unemployment

The extent to which persons are unable to find sufficient employment will be studied in the census bureau's current population survey this month. It was announced by district supervisor Louis B. Basheller of Fort Wayne. The current population survey interviews each month a representative cross-section of 25,000 households throughout the country, including a number in the Decatur area.

In order to measure the impact of layoffs and reduced hours upon the nation's employment situation, the regular questions on employment and unemployment which are asked each month, will be supplemented this month and periodically hereafter by special questions addressed to persons who worked only part time during the survey week. These persons will be asked the reason they were working short hours and whether they desired full-time employment.

In May, the most recent month in which a similar study was undertaken, it was estimated from the survey that about 2½ million persons were working less than full-time because of slack work, material shortages, job turn-over, the unavailability of full-time jobs or similar economic factors. This number had about doubled since last year.

The survey will be conducted in Allen and Adams counties during the week of August 14 to 20. Supervisor Basheller emphasized that all individual information furnished to the census bureau is treated in absolute confidence and that only statistical summaries are ever published.

Taxpayers appearing shall have a right to be heard thereon. After the tax levies have been determined, and presented to the County Auditor not later than two days prior to the second Monday in September, and the levy fixed by the County Tax Adjustment Board, or on their failure so to do, by the County Auditor, ten or more taxpayers feeling themselves aggrieved by such levies, may appeal to the State Board of Tax Commissioners for further and final hearing thereon, by filing a petition with the County Auditor on or before the fourth Monday of September or on before the tenth day after publication by the county auditor of the tax rates charged whichever date is later and the State Board will fix a date for hearing in this County.
