### Two Slightly Hurt In Auto Accident Arrests Are Made On Traffic Counts

Two persons were injured slightly as the result of an accident Wednesday. Two others were arrested and fined in justice of the peace courts, and another man was involved in a traffic skirmish with an unidentified driver.

The two injured, Arleta Mae Sorgen, route 1, Berne, and Ernie Harris, route 1, Bluffton, were involved in an accident two and one-half miles north and one mile west of Berne at a county road intersection. The vision of both drivers, one going west, the other south, was obscured by an orchard at the intersection, and a truck, driven by Harris, struck amidship a car driven by Miss Sorgen.

Miss Sorgen suffered lacerations on the back of the head, an injured right shoulder and shock. The accident occurred near her home, where she was taken, and a doctor from Berne was summoned. Harris suffered lacerations above the left eye, and injuries to his nose and shoulder. He did not need medical attention.

Sheriff Herman Bowman, who investigated, estimated damage to the truck at \$250, to the car at \$350. Jake Swift was arrested by police and fined \$1 and costs, amounting to \$11.75, by justice of the peace Floyd Hunter as the result of an accident at Thirteenth street and Nuttman avenue between cars driven by Jake Hess and Swift. The car driven by Hess, of 621 Schirmeyer street, was making a left hand turn from Thirteenth into Nuttman and was struck by the Swift car which was attempting to pass on the left side. Swift was charged with improper passing at an intersection. Damage to the Hess car was estimated at \$25; to the Swift car at \$15, and to a clipped highway sign at \$5.

Sheriff Bowman also arrested Arnold Weidner, of route 1, Berne, for failure to stop at U. S. highway 27. Weidner was fined \$1 and costs, totalling \$12.55, in justice of the peace court in Berne.

Dickinson Alberson, route 1, reported to police that he started to make a right turn at Fourth and Monroe streets when his car was struck by another car passing on the right side. Alberson did not get the name of the other driver.

### Put Restrictions On Issuing Permits More Stringent On Permits To Veterans

There will be a more stringent regard for issuing hunting and fishing permits from the clerk's office, according to Edward Jaberg, county clerk, as a result of a letter from the Indiana department of conservation.

The letter states that in accordance with the law, the applicant must present his discharge from the service in order to get a permit. This would bar men in the service who do not have a discharge from previous service; they cannot get a free permit until they have been discharged.

The letter also notes that a free permit can not be issued upon presentation of a previous free permit; if a man wants a duplicate permit he must present his discharge.

The clerk's office will act accordingly in the future, Jaberg said, and no more free permits will be given unless the laws are complied with.

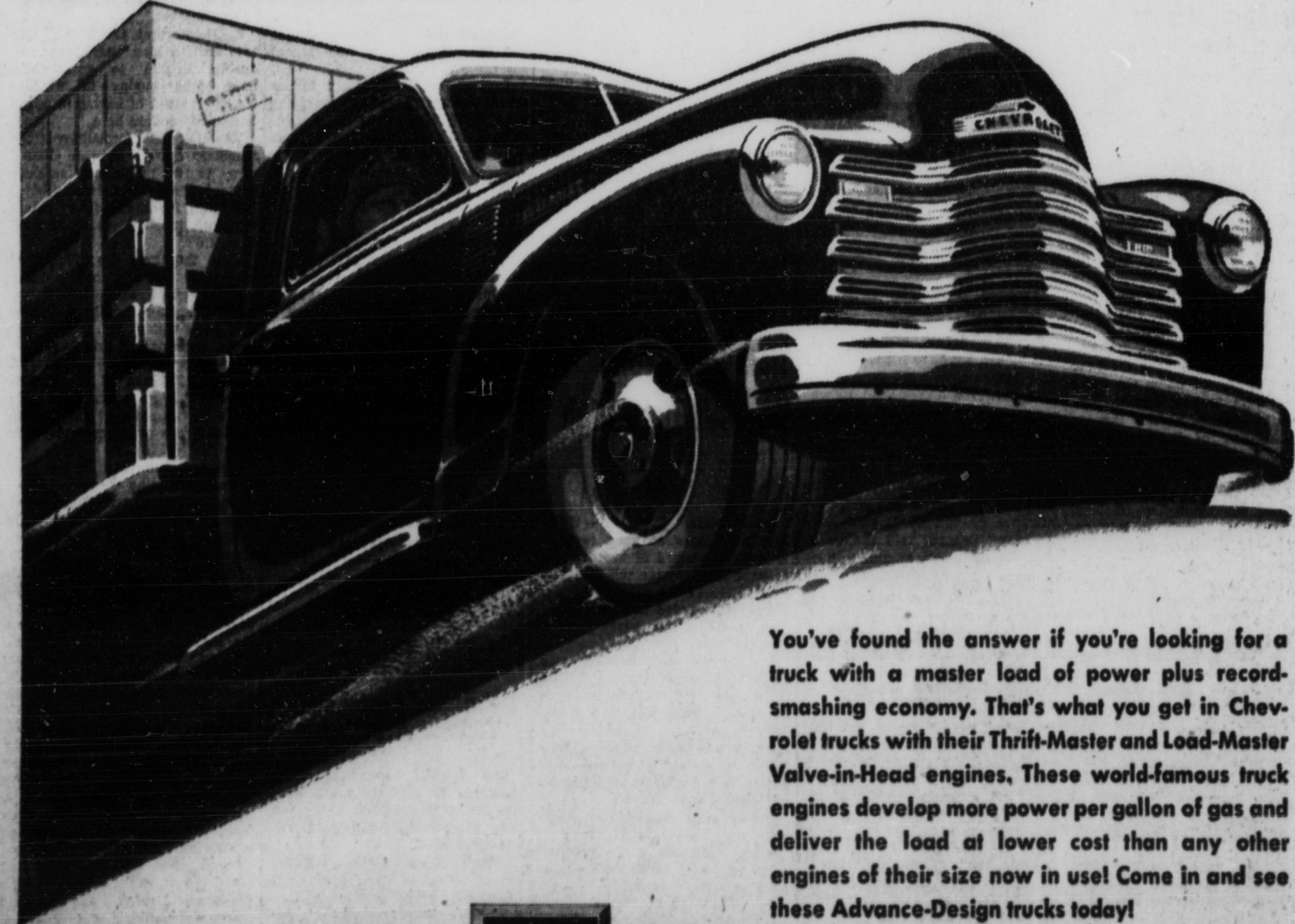
