Creamed Comments On S.S. Lesson

* Creamed Comments on the Sunday School Lesson, Jesus and the Psalms, Psalm 8:2; Matthew 21:15,16; Psalm 110:1; Matthew 41:45; Psalms 118: 22,23; Matthew 21:38-42; Luke 24:4, for Sunday, September 11.

The devotional value of the Psalms is seen as they express our experience. In these Psalms as recorded in our lesson we see how they expressed the experience of Christ.

Psalm 8:2, "Out of the mouth of babes and sucklings hast thou ordained strength because of thine enemies, that thou mightest still the enemy and the avenger." God has ordained that even the feeblest representative of humanity should be his champions to confound and silence those who oppose his kingdom and deny his goodness and providential government. This is illustrated in the following two verses.

Matthew 15:16, "And when the chief priests and scribes saw the wonderful things that he did and the children crying in the temple, and saying, Hosanna to the son of David, they were sore displeased and said unto him, Hearst thou what these say? And Jesus said to them, Yea, have ye never read, out of the mouth of babes and sucklings thou has perfected praise?" At the end of Jesus' triumphant entrance he cleaned the temple and the triumph of Jesus was voiced by children singing Hosanna. All this displeased the chief priests and scribes; Jesus met this criticism by quoting a well known Psalm which as a child and youth he had learned, and which now voiced his experience. "Have ye never read" suggests either that much Bible reading does not grip us, or that we may not have the religious experience necessary to understand the scriptures we read.

Psalm 110:1, "The Lord said unto my Lord. Sit thou at my right hand, until I make thine enemies thy footstool." The first word, "Lord" refers to Jehovah the second word, "Lord" to the representative of Israel which unconsciously to the Psalmist applies to the Messiah who shall reign with power. This verse is illustrated in Christ in the following five verses.

of God. Let us never become insensitive to the fact that God's great message is coming to our hearts all the time. We are always under the power of the Holy Spirit, although often we do not yield ourselves to his gracious power.

Clericus Says:
Clericus says: "The mighty power working through us is known as God's providence. It is a part of the great stream of revelation which, through the ages has been proceeding from the mind and heart

Matthew 23:41-45. "While the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them saying What think ye of Christ? Whose son is he? They say unto him, The son of David. He saith unto them, How then in spirit doth he call him Lord, saying The Lord said to my Lord. Sit thou upon my right hand, till I make thine enemies thy footstool." Jesus had been teaching in the temple, speaking in parables in which his critics were denounced in self defense. He now takes the initiative in an offensive movement in asking them a series of questions. Jesus proceeds to question his critics as to the ancestry of the Lord in the Psalm quoted. How is the doctrine that he is descended from David consistent with what David says when he called him Lord? A Lord or master is a superior. The word here does not necessarily imply divinity, but only superiority. David calls him his superior his lord, his master, his lawgiver, and expresses his willingness to obey him. If the Messiah was merely to be a descendant of David, as other men descended from parents if he was to have a human nature only if he did not exist when David wrote, with what propriety then could he call him Lord. — Barnes.

Matthew 21:38-42. "But when the husbandmen saw the son, they said among themselves, This is the heir, come let us kill him and let us seize upon his inheritance. And they caught him and cast him out of the vineyard, and slew him. Jesus saith unto them, Did ye never read in the scriptures, The stone which the builders rejected, the same is become the head of the corner: this is the Lord's doing and it is marvelous in our eyes." Three principal teachings emerge from these passages. The first is that Jesus is a stone; he is not a shifting sand. The second lesson is that he is the cornerstone. Jesus is the only begotten son, the only hope of the world. The third teaching is that Jesus was rejected. Psalms 118:22,23, was fulfilled in him.

Luke 21:44. "And he said unto them, These are the words which I spake unto you, while I was yet with you, that all things must be fulfilled, which were written in the law of Moses, and in the prophets, and in the Psalms concerning me." Jesus is talking to his disciples after his resurrection. He is showing how the scriptures were fulfilled through his death and resurrection.

Our Preacher Says
The most of us fall at the point of waiting for results when we have done our best. Things do not always happen right away. The farmer sows seed, but he must wait for days and months for results. A child attends school and little mental change is seen daily but over years of persistent mental effort the reward of an education is attained. The soul that considers the final outcome of Christian faith and practice may see few victories, but in time God who takes care of results will give a great reward.
