Youth Is Fined For Reckless Driving

Two Minor Wrecks Are Reported Here

One youth was fined in mayor's court Monday, another was arrested and is to appear in justice of the peace court later this week, and two traffic mishaps were reported to police and Adams county officials.

Harold Nash, 20, of Homestead 8, was fined \$5 and costs totalling \$16.75 by Mayor John Doan in court Monday. Nash was arrested by police Sunday for reckless driving. In an affidavit signed by prosecuting attorney, Severin Schurger, Nash was charged with speeding 50 miles an hour in a 30 mile zone on North Second street, Henry Kinser, of Elwood, was arrested by police Monday for reckless driving. He will appear Friday in JP court.

An accident, involving cars driven by Maynard Lehman, route 1, Berne, and Gerald Kelly, Bryan, O., was investigated by sheriff Herman Bowman. The mishap occurred on U. S. highway 27 in Berne. Lehman was making a left turn at the intersection of 27 and Hoosier street, and was struck by the Kelly car which was trying to pass. Damage to the Lehman car was estimated at \$100; to the Kelly car \$85.

An automobile-pedestrian accident occurred when Ralph Hawkins walked into a car driven by Chalmers DeBolt, Homestead 34, on Winchester street. DeBolt was able to bring his car to a halt, and no one was injured.

On Farm Training Here For Veterans

On the farm training is now available to Adams county veterans. It was announced today by Hansel Foley, county superintendent of schools. The training will be under the direction of J. E. Thacker, recent addition as vocational-agriculture instructor at the Adams Central high school staff.

Any veteran within the Adams Central district, Mr. Foley said, who is interested in the program, should contact the county superintendent's office. He added that those not in the district should apply and they will be taken in order. There is a 12-man limit to the number of veterans who may be in training. Thacker will devote the afternoons of each day to the veterans' training. He will conduct his vocational-agriculture classes at the Adams Central school during the mornings.

Chicago Policeman Is Killed By Youths

Two Young Negroes Sought In Slaying

Chicago, Sept. 20. — (UP)— A policeman was shot and killed today when he tried to question two young negroes carrying a suspicious package.

One or both of the two youths fired eight shots in policeman David Keating, 30, at close range in what authorities called a "cold and willful murder."

They said Keating never had a chance to draw his gun. He was pronounced dead at Evangelical hospital.

The gunmen were carrying a long, newspaper wrapped package that resembled a shotgun or rifle. Cartridges from a foreign pistol of about .32 caliber were found at the scene.

Two youths, Sidney Johnson, 17, and Roosevelt Bacuss, 16, were sought by police after they were reported in the neighborhood shortly after the killing.

Ray Crane, chief of the uniformed force, said that Keating, the father of four children, had been questioning many of the youths in the neighborhood in an effort to stamp out a wave of burglaries.

Police Have Battle With Dog Here Today

Police had a battle with a dog today in the west part of Decatur and it finally was necessary to destroy the animal. Reports were received that the dog was acting queerly and was running around in several blocks in the west part of the city.

Police made an effort to coax the dog into captivity but it refused the invitation. Finally a pole was used to trap the animal but it continued to charge the officers.

Local officials urge that owners of dogs do not permit children to play with them during the 30-day quarantine. Few violations have been reported since the quarantine was placed in effect, according to officials.

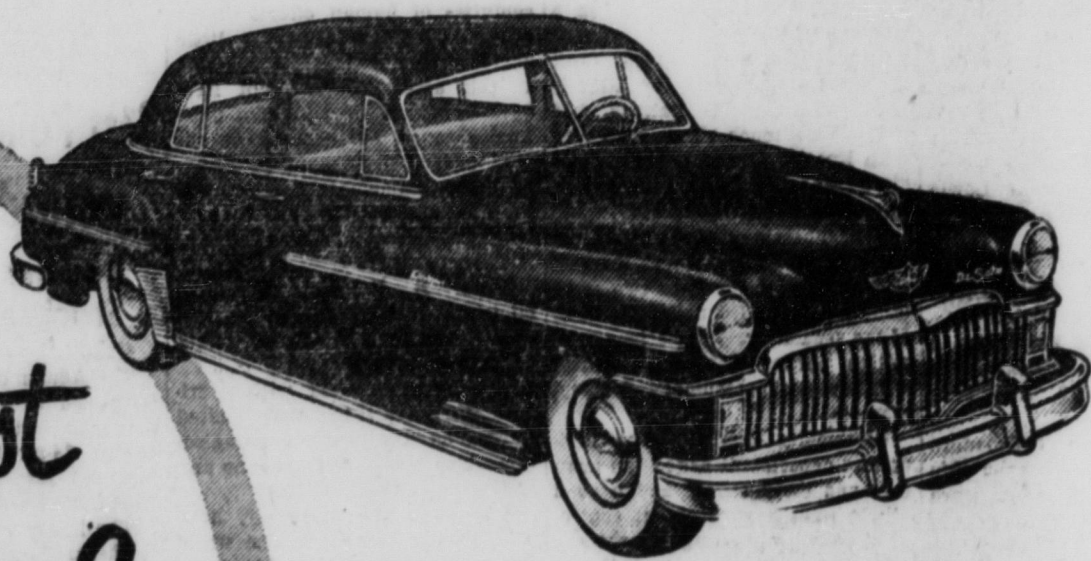
