

Motorist Is Fined On Traffic Charge

Police Investigate Pair Of Accidents

One man was fined by justice of the peace Floyd Hunter in court Monday evening and two accidents were investigated by police.

Othmer Moeller, of Celina, O., was fined \$5 and costs by justice Hunter when Moeller pleaded guilty to failure to stop at a stop sign at U. S. highway 27 three miles north of Berne. Moeller was arrested a week ago by deputy sheriff Robert Shraluka, who ordered him to appear before the justice of the peace.

Two cars were slightly damaged when neither driver would yield the right of way to the other. A car driven by Agnes Lichte, route 4, and one driven by James Lough, 1227 Madison street, collided at the corner of Thirteenth and Adams streets. Both cars were making turns off Adams onto Thirteenth—the Lough car a right-hand turn, the Lichte car a left—when they met. Police estimated the damage to the Lichte car at \$10 to the Lough car, \$30.

A car driven by Stanley Friedley, 123 North Fifth street, in leaving a parking position, drove into the path of a car driven by Otis Dennis, of Bluffton. Damage to the Friedley car was \$15; to the Dennis car, \$20.



Two Men In Hospital

After Altercation

Discharge Of Man Blamed For Fray

Columbia City, Ind., Nov. 22. — (UP)— Two men were in hospitals today as a result of what police said appeared to be one's police said to kill the other.

Austin Coyle, 52, R. R. 1 Columbia City, was in a Columbia City hospital with a severe head wound which state trooper Neilson Winebrenner said was caused by a blow from a baseball bat.

Wilson Hoffman, 35, R. R. 1 Columbia City, was in St. Joseph's hospital at Fort Wayne with a gunshot wound.

Neither was in serious condition.

Winebrenner said Hoffman, a farmer, discharged Coyle yesterday as a farm hand. He said Coyle left, brooded over his job loss in tavern, and returned to Hoffman's home last night after the Hoffman family had retired.

Hoffman was shot with a revolver as he slept. He told Winebrenner he jumped out of bed, grabbed a baseball bat and hit Coyle over the head, knocking him unconscious.

Winebrenner said a charge of assault and battery with intent to kill probably would be filed against Coyle today.

The incident occurred at 845 p.m. at Hoffman's home three miles northeast of South Whitley, according to deputy sheriff Lee Gross.

Clips 13 Minutes Off Flight Record

London, Nov. 22. — (UP)— The Pan American stratocruiser "Flying Cloud" today clipped 13 minutes off the recently-established New York-to-London commercial airliner record.

It completed the Trans-Atlantic journey in eight hours and 55 minutes.

Piloted by Capt. Charles R. Titus of Great Neck, N. Y., the four-engined stratocruiser was helped by a 120-mile tail wind and averaged 420 miles per hour ground speed.

To Eliminate Roaches

Gum camphor is a speedy remedy to rid the house of roaches. Another is to sprinkle powdered borax mixed with sugar near their haunts. A rag soaked in kerosene will also drive them away, if left near the infested area.
