Court News

Schedules Submitted

Inheritance tax schedule submitted for the Bertha Baker estate, finding its net value to be \$2,205.75, with no tax due. Final report filed by the administrator, Leoma Sprout, who also filed the proper proofs showing the estate to be in order; the court then closed the case.

Schedule to determine the inheritance tax of the heirs of the Louise Bouck estate submitted by Herman Bouck, administrator, revealing the net estate to be \$12,551.71 with seven heirs; referred to county assessor.

Schedule to determine the inheritance tax due on the Blanche LaFever estate also filed, showing the net estate to be \$9,649, with six heirs.

Petition Filed

Petition to include eight additional heirs to the estate of Rodolfo Garcia filed by the administratrix, Eugenia Cagiano. The personal estate had formerly been appraised at \$350.

Estate Closed

Administrator John Doan filed final report for the Henry Costello estate, revealing \$91.54, left, for distribution; report shows that proper publications have been made, liabilities against the estate have been met; report approved, administrator discharged and the estate closed.

Motion Overruled

The court overruled a motion to strike the defendant's petition to modify the monthly payments in the case of Maude Morgan vs Lawrence Morgan, a complaint for separation from bed and board. Morgan stated that the \$80 monthly payments he was ordered to meet were too high. Attorney for the plaintiff, Hubert McElhaney, however, stated in the motion to strike that the court's final judgment is not subject to modification.

Docket Action

Following filing of verifications of notices pertinent to the case of Glen Schaefer et al., a petition for drainage, the court ordered that the petition be docketed as an "action pending in this court."

Current Population Survey Next Week

The census bureau's current population survey, a compilation of a cross-section of employment and unemployment in the United States, will be conducted during the week of May 14 to 20. The announcement was made by district supervisor Dorothy M. Stolte from her office in Fort Wayne; the supervisor added that many of those to be interviewed will be in the

Decatur area.

There are approximately 25,000 households throughout the nation visited to enlighten government on employment statistics useful to government, business and industry. This particular type of survey has been conducted by the government for the past 10 years, and as with the recent census, all information is held in the strictest confidence.

From 1882 to 1948, inclusive, there were 4,719 lynchings in the United States.

Three Persons Fined On Traffic Charges

Three persons pleaded guilty in justice of the peace court to traffic charges brought against them by state or city police, and justice Floyd Hunter assessed a \$1 and cost fine against each of them. Mrs. Esther Doehrmann, of route 1, arrested by state trooper Bob Mercer Wednesday, pleaded guilty to a charge of disregarding the stop sign at U.S. 27 and the Blingen road, about four miles north of Decatur. Mrs. Doehrmann appeared in justice court and paid the \$1.15 fine.

Robert Jackson, 116 North Fifteenth street, was arrested by city police Wednesday for reckless driving, speeding 45 miles an hour on West Monroe, appeared shortly after and paid a like fine. As did Leonard Schwartz, of Berne, route 1, who was arrested early Wednesday morning and appeared in court Wednesday evening.
