## Homemaking Tips

**Cleaning the Refrigerator**  
Cleanliness is an important factor in obtaining efficiency from the refrigerator.

A good time to do a thorough cleaning job in the refrigerator is at the time it is defrosted. This should be done before the frost is more than one-fourth inch thick. When defrosting the dial should be set on "Defrost" and left over-night.

After the frost is all melted, everything including the shelves should be removed. The homemaker should wash the inside of the refrigerator as well as the inside and outside of the freezing unit with a solution made with one level tablespoon of baking soda dissolved in each quart of warm water. (A harsh, scratchy cleaning powder should never be used on any part of the refrigerator.) After thoroughly washing all surfaces with the soda water solution, the homemaker should wash them a second time in clean water.

Soap and water may be used to wash shelves, drip pan, ice trays and containers and then rinsed, turning back the control to normal setting as soon as the cleaning is finished. Ice cube trays should be filled to about one-fourth inch from the top with fresh cold water. All food containers should be clean and dry before they are returned to the shelves.

The cleaning should be done

quickly, so that the refrigerator will remain as cold as possible.

Automatic defrosting refrigerators or refrigerators to which automatic defrosting devices have been added, may be cleaned once a week or when the homemaker desires.

The outside of the refrigerator should be washed with warm soapy water using a mild soap or a detergent, rinsed in warm water and thoroughly dried. For protection and added attractiveness, a cream wax polish should be used.

### Cottage Cheese

Should pasteurized milk be used for making cottage cheese?

It is just as important to use pasteurized milk in making cottage cheese as it is to use pasteurized milk for drinking. Some of the diseases transmitted through unsafe milk are tuberculosis, typhoid fever, scarlet fever, diphtheria, septic sore throat and undulant fever.

## Congress Likely To Favor Some Control

### Senate Committee Approval Is Seen

Washington, Aug. 1—(UPI)—Chairman Burnet R. Maybank predicted today that the Senate banking committee will approve some form of standby wage-price control and rationing powers for President Truman.

The South Carolina Democrat made the statement as the banking committee resumed closed sessions on control legislation. Stronger proposals than those so far made by Mr. Truman were assured of a committee test vote before nightfall.

Maybank would not say whether he will support any of the expected moves to write stronger powers into the original White House bill.

"But it's my guess that the committee will approve standby powers," he told reporters.

Meanwhile, apparently convinced that Congress is determined to do something about rising prices, the White House was drafting its version of compromise legislation to give the President some form of standby price-wage control authority.

It was understood that President Truman's advisers still insisted that no such drastic controls are necessary now. But since Congress appeared likely to enact them, they decided to get on record with the kind of standby authority they would prefer.

It was reported the administration's recommendations will be submitted in the house tomorrow if and when it becomes obvious that it is going to pass a bill with strict controls.

### Issues Figures On Fishing Licenses

#### Report Is Issued By County Clerk

The number of fishermen hasn't varied much this year as compared with last year, Ed Jaeger, county clerk said today. Last year, 195 licenses were issued, much less than the 407 issued in May or the 418 sold in June.

However, Jaeger explained, 518 have been issued in the first seven months, compared favorably with the 1,763 issued last year.

Last year's license sent a total of \$2,054 to the state treasury.

For the conservation department, Clerk's fees took \$184.40 of the money spent here in licenses.

In July \$27 was collected \$152 to be sent to the state treasurer, and \$103 for the clerk's fees.


The state treasurer has received \$1,746.70 so far this year from Adams county for fishing, hunting and trapping licenses.

Most persons buy their licenses in May and June, more than 800 having been sold in the two months. Only 16 persons bought their licenses in February, while 313 purchased them the first month, January.

"You know how it is," Thyen said. "You just don't hope to get 100 percent compliance. Some of these are apartments where the families eat at restaurants and don't have any garbage."
