Sale On October 16

Cletus Miller, proprietor of Riverview Gardens at the north edge of the city, announced today that he would offer for sale at public auction all of the equipment in his popular tavern at 7 p.m. on October 16.

The tavern has a three-way liquor license and the place has been developed into one of the most widely

known eating and entertainment spots in this section of the state. Miller did not give his reason for disposing of the business. Charles Kent of the Kent Realty and Auction company, who will conduct the auction, stated that Miller's lease on the building extended for three more years.

The advertisement appears in this issue of this paper. In addition to the sale of all tavern furniture and equipment, the purchaser will be given the opportunity to acquire the stock of merchandise on invoice price, Kent explained.

The tavern has been operated for more than three years under Miller's ownership and management.

Members Of Capone Gang To Testify

Senate Probers In
Hearing At Chicago

Chicago, Oct. 5. — (UP) — The senate crime investigating committee sought to learn today whether the old Capone gang has rebuilt its empire into a nationwide "syndicate" that rules gambling, vice, narcotics traffic and other rackets. The committee, headed by Sen. Estes Kefauver, D., Tenn., opened two-day secret sessions at 10 a.m. in the U.S. courthouse where scarface Al Capone was sentenced in 1931 for income tax evasion.

Kefauver, who arrived here from Washington early today for the hearings, announced that committee agents had served 50 subpoenas on mobsters, minor hoodlums and others who might have information to give the senators.

He said they "hope to serve about 40 more." But he admitted tacitly that the committee was running into difficulty rounding up top syndicate leaders who "took it on the lam" when committee investigators came to town and after the gangster slaying of ace detective William Drury Sept. 25.

Drury, slain from ambush after he wrote newspaper exposes of the underworld, had been expected to give important information to the committee and it was believed that gangland resorted to bullets to prevent him from testifying.

Kefauver warned that any bosses who fled to avoid appearing faced possible contempt citations and prison sentences. Chief investigator George Robinson said the committee particularly wanted to question Tony Accardo, reputed boss of the Chicago syndicate, and an "Angelo" Fischetti, believed to be either Charles or

Rocco Fischetti—who were "vacationing" somewhere south of the border.

There were hints that they might now be heading for Havana or Guatemala.

Mexican authorities said extradition of the two did not appear possible on the strength of a committee subpoena. It probably would be difficult to eject Accardo and Fischetti from the country, these sources added.

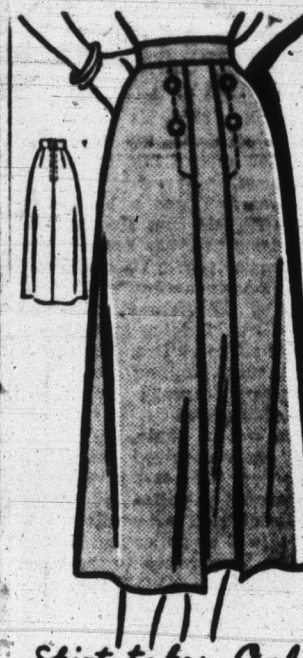
Jack Guzik, business agent for the syndicate, also was missing. But the roll of persons served with subpoenas was crowded with names linked with Capone's prohibition-era regime.

Three Chiropractors Face Court Orders

Indianapolis, Oct. 5. — (UP) — Chiropractors in three Indiana cities faced court orders today to stop practicing in the state.

A temporary injunction was issued against J. Warren Schalk, in Marion county superior court here yesterday, and deputy state attorney general Thomas L. Webber said similar injunctions were ordered against E. G. Caley, Peru, and E. C. Larsen, Kokomo. The Indiana board of medical registration and examination requested the action in all three cases.
