Three Persons Hurt In Auto Accident

One Hospitalized Following Accident

Three persons were injured in a traffic accident Saturday, one of them seriously enough to remain in the Adams county memorial hospital though attaches there stated his condition is "good."

The three were rushed to the hospital from the curve just this side of the Ohio state line on U. S. 224 where a car driven by James Roy, of route 1, Monroeville, failed to negotiate the curve.

The accident was investigated

by state trooper Bob Mercer, who stated that Roy apparently approached the curve at a high rate of speed, lost control of the car which uprooted a tree and a stretch of fence along the highway.

Margaret Hooger, of Fort Wayne, a passenger in the car, suffered lacerations of the legs and arms, and Joe Clem, also of route 1, Monroeville, suffered head injuries.

Roy suffered severe lacerations of the face and wrists, and underwent surgery. Mercer stated that the 1949 Ford was completely demolished.

14 Persons Killed On State Highways

Largest Violent Toll Of October

Weekend Indiana traffic accidents claimed 14 lives, the biggest violent death toll of the month, and a 15th person died of injuries suffered earlier in the week.



